During the January term, chapel was presented to the Whitworth Student Body in a new manner. A contemporary student-directed worship was held each Wednesday for those students who wanted to attend.




The presidential mediation was presented to Dr. Mark Lowell Koehler at his inauguration as the thirteenth president of Whitworth College on October 9, 1965.






A Presidential Medallion was presented to Dr. Mark Koehler as the 13th president. It is the first such medallion to be worn by a president of Whitworth College.
