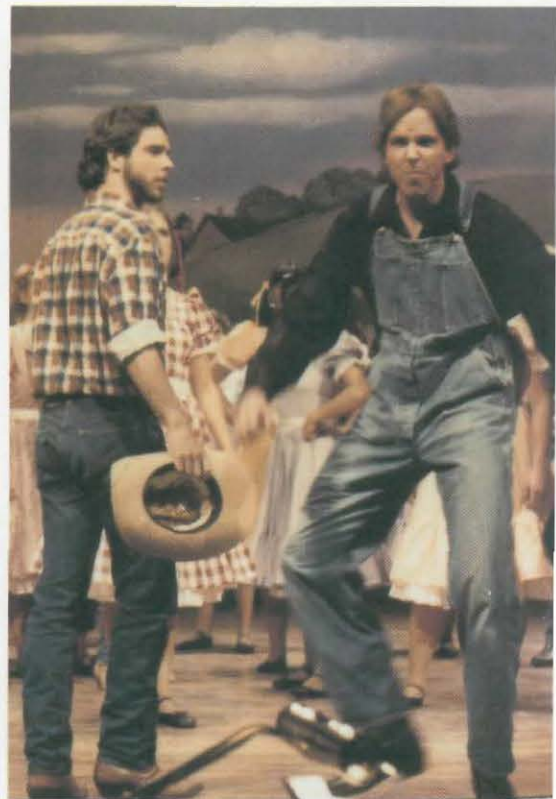

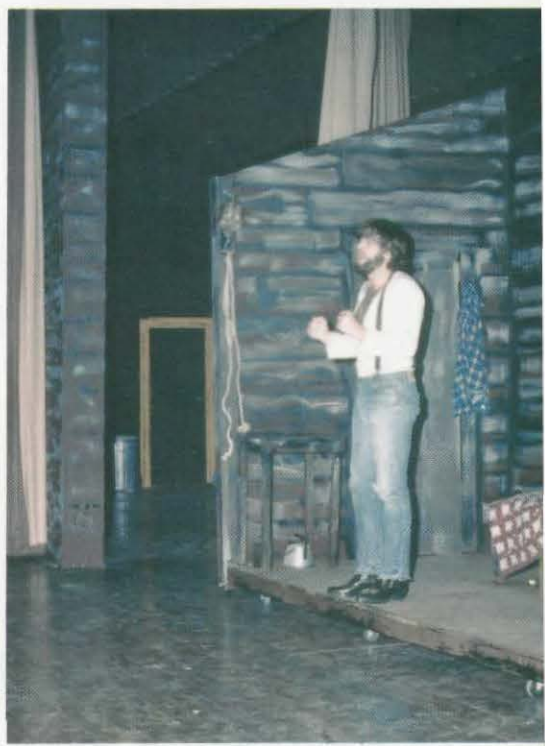

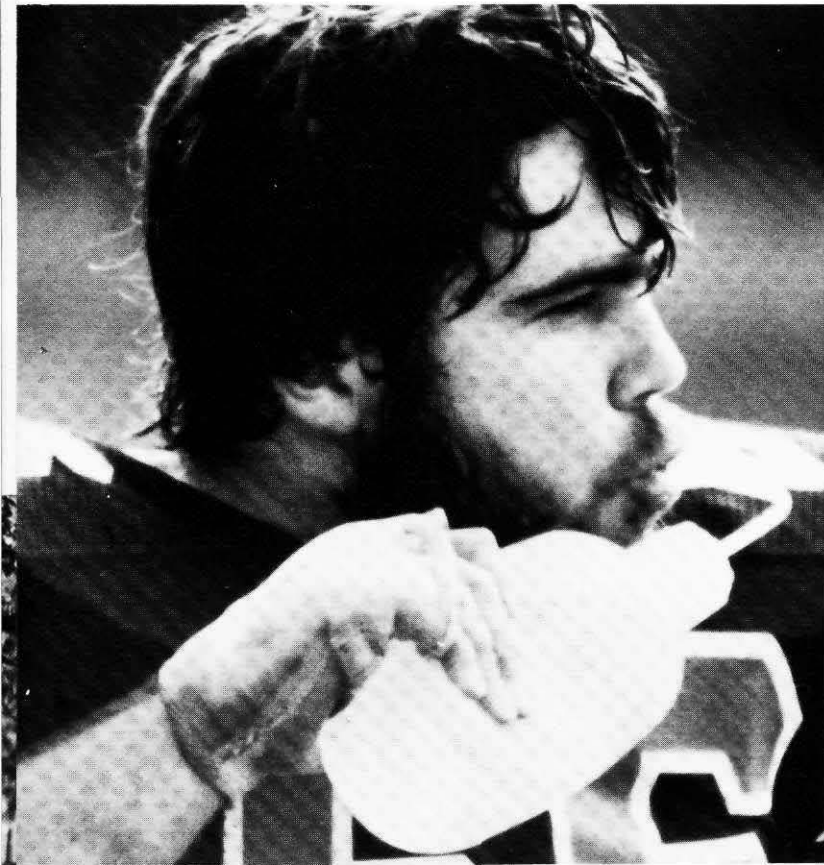

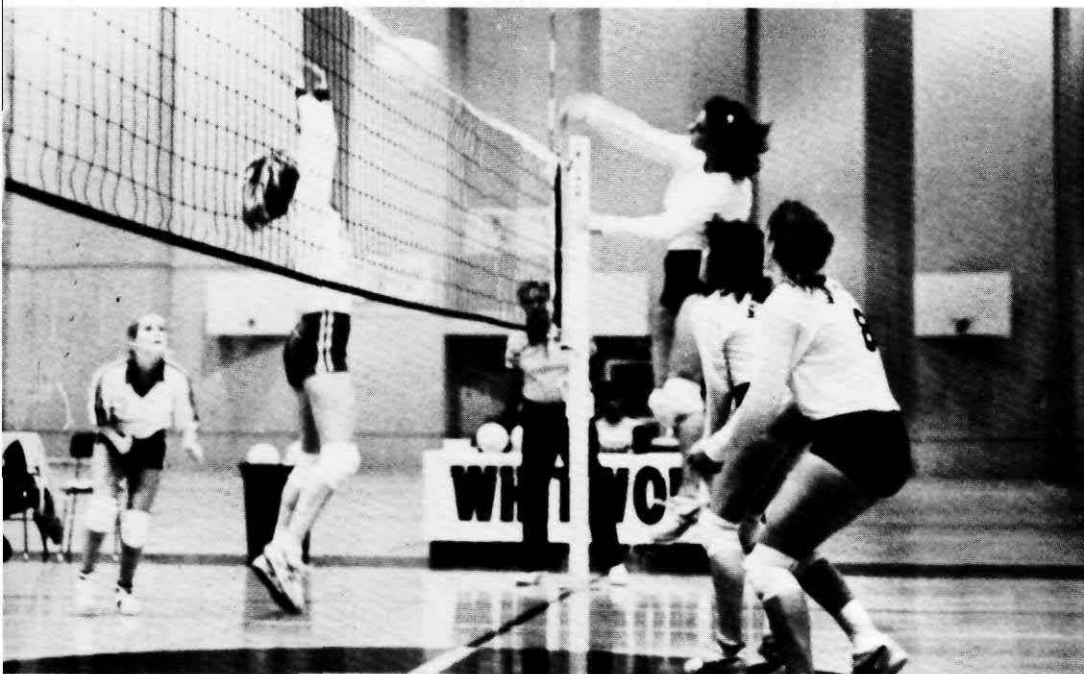

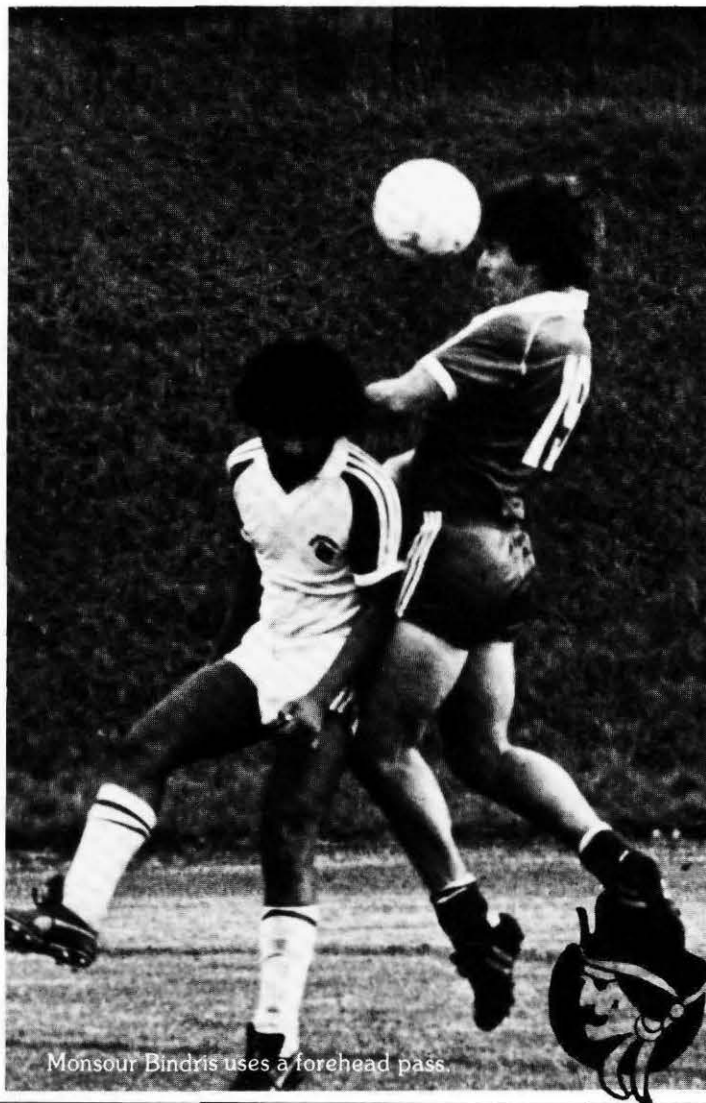


PIRATE SOCCER

I.M. VOLLEYBALL, FOOTBALL

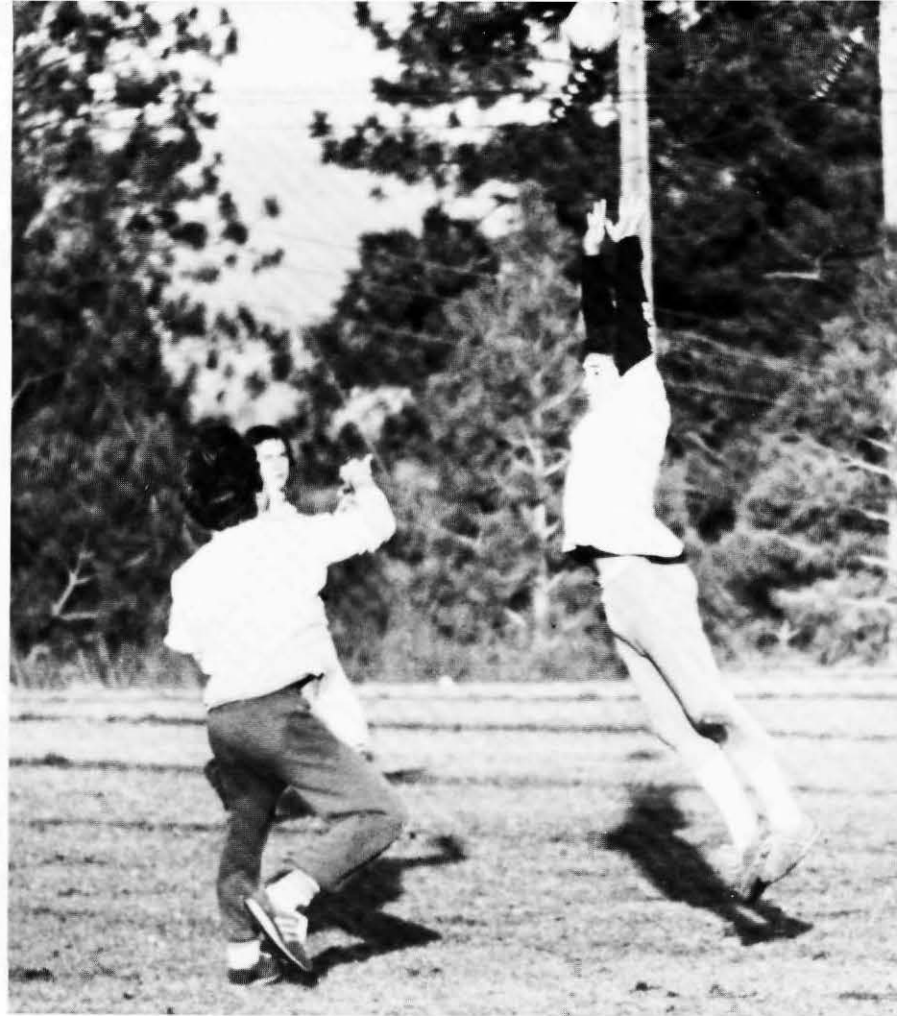

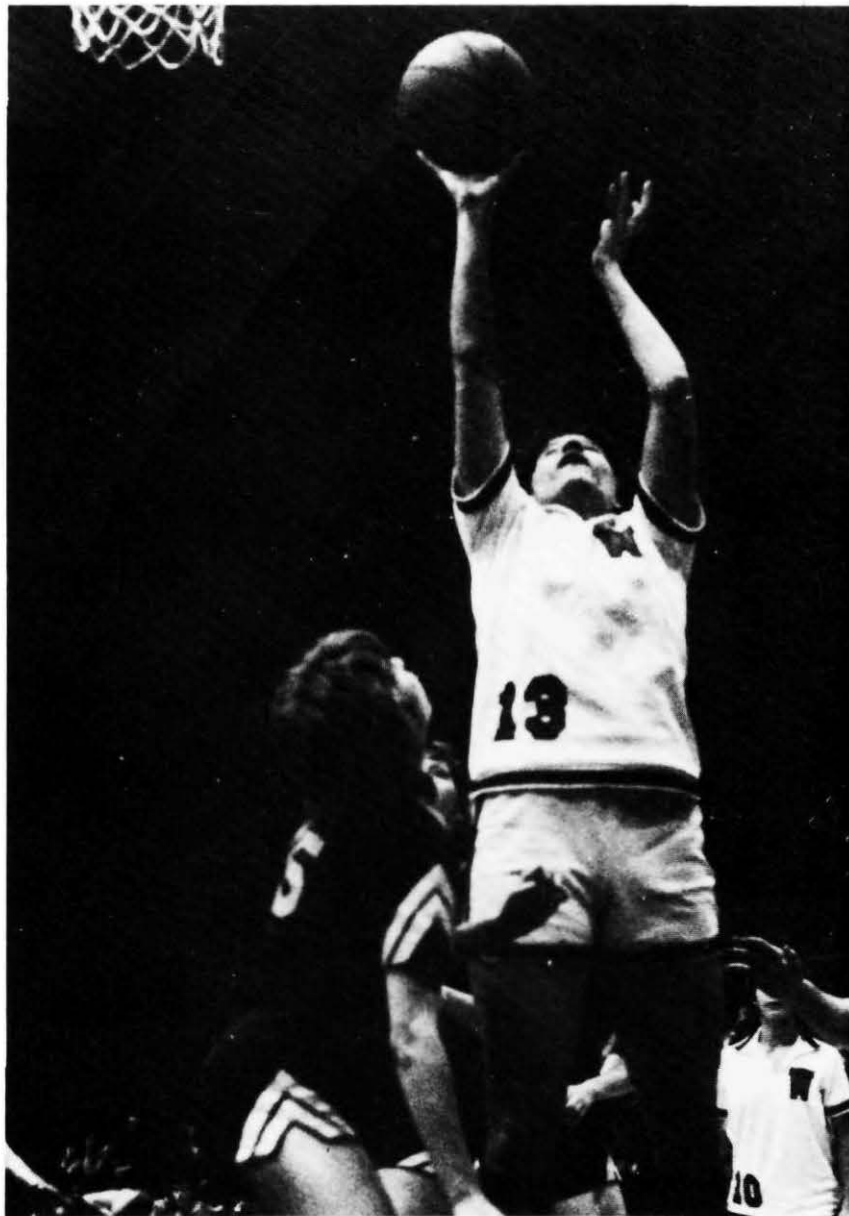

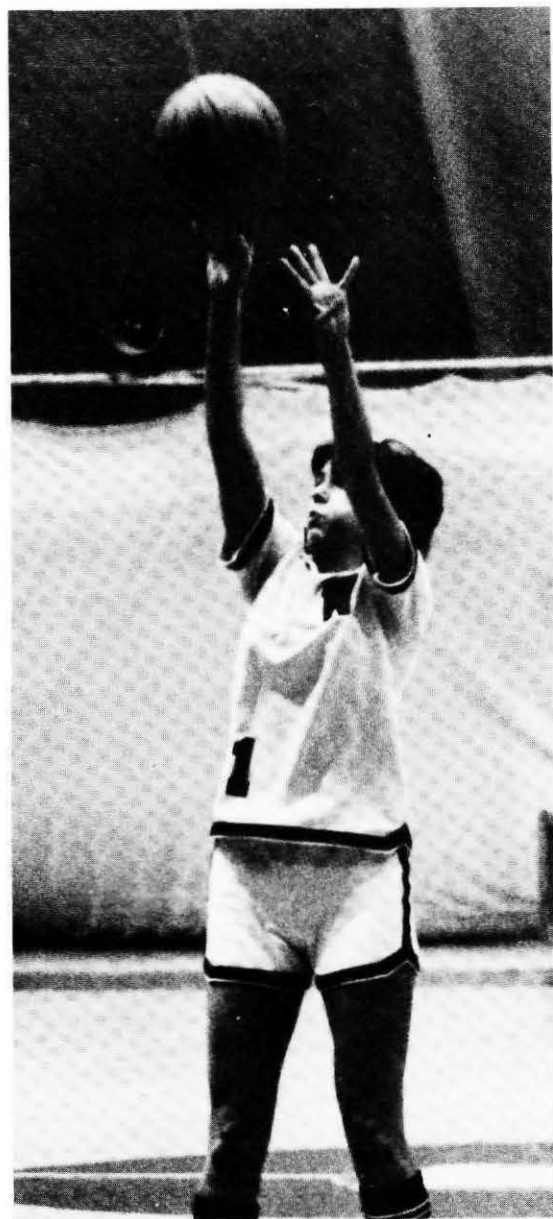

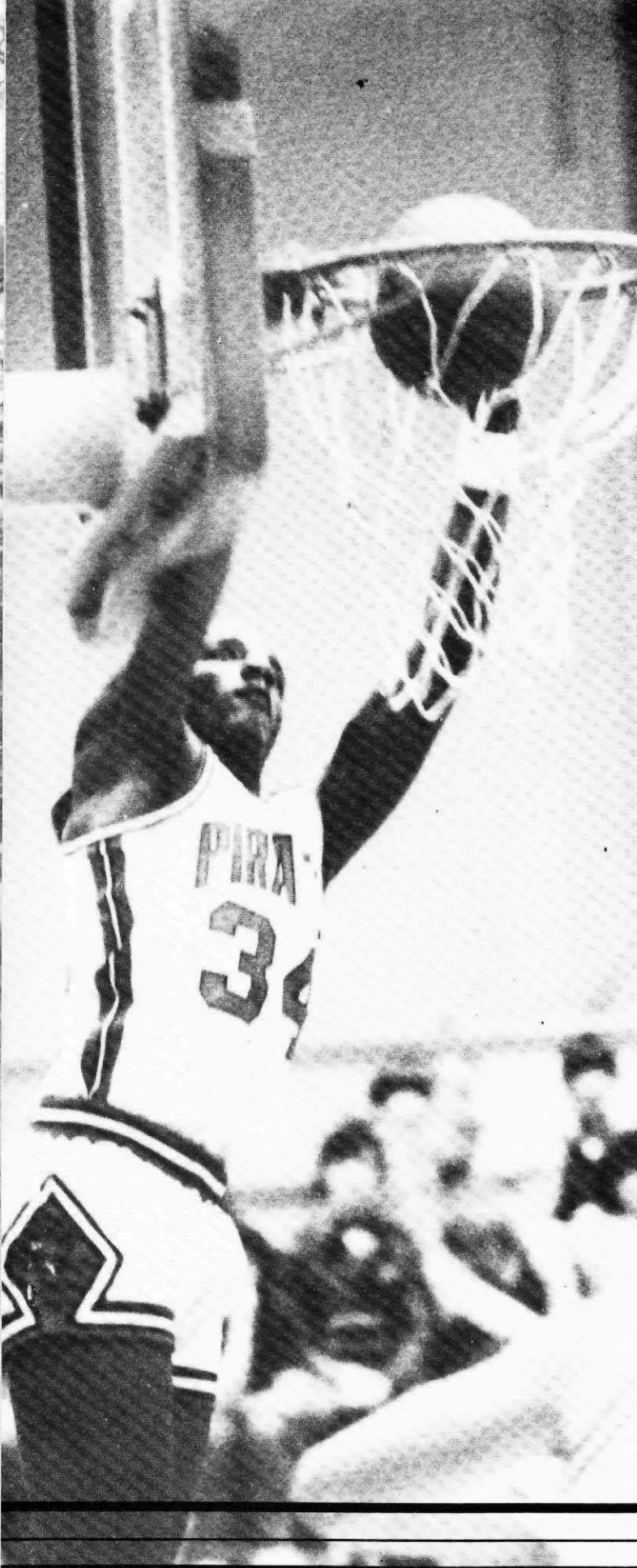
Jennifer Tinkle and Bonnie Mittler struggle for control of the ball as Gail Rice looks on.

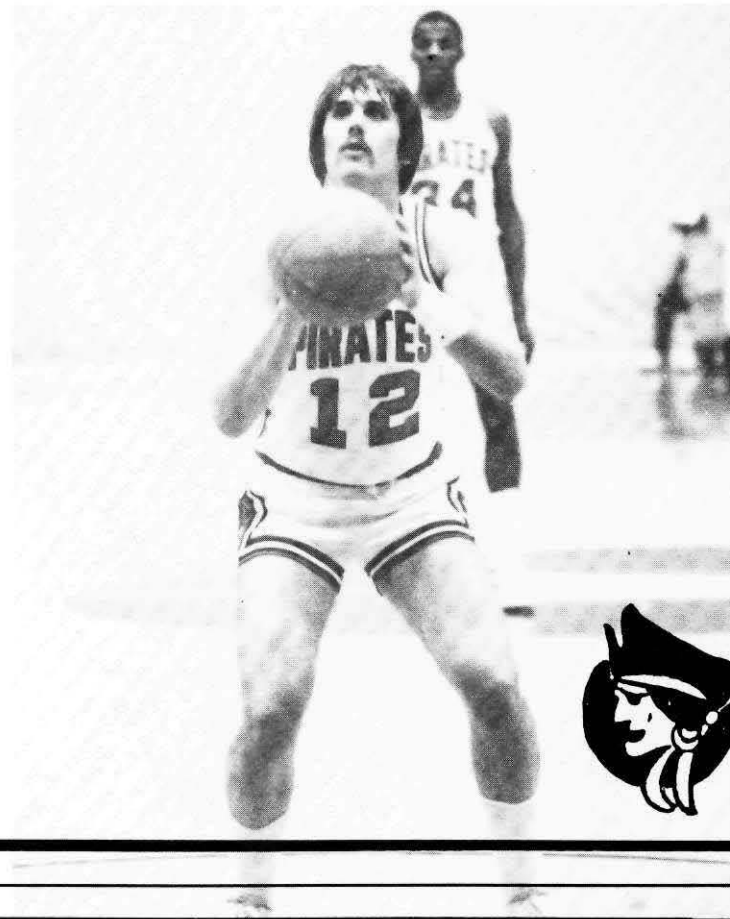

BUC BASKET- BALL

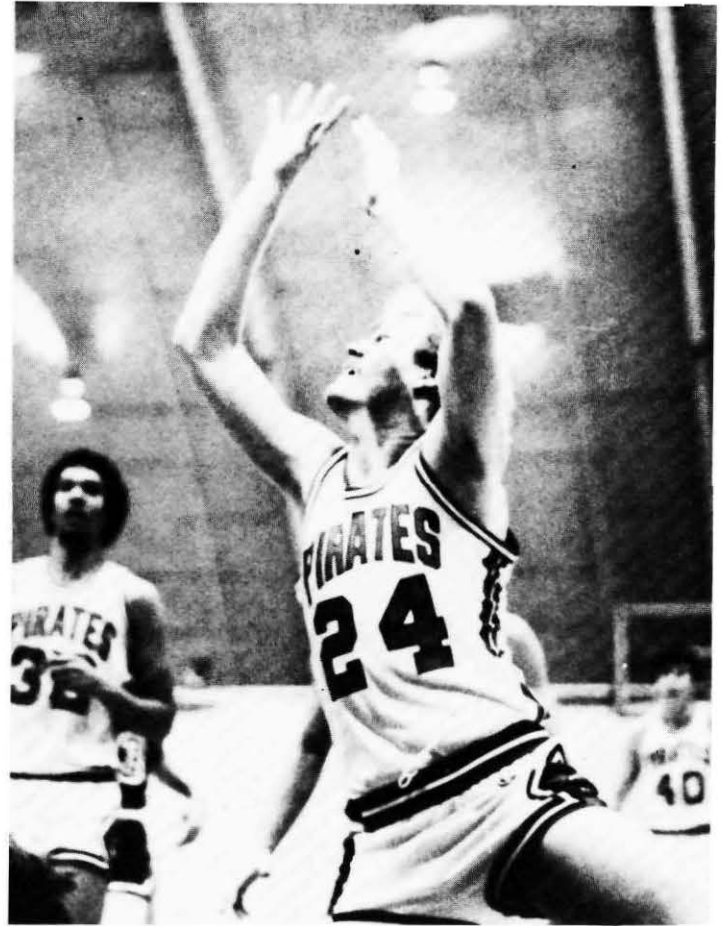

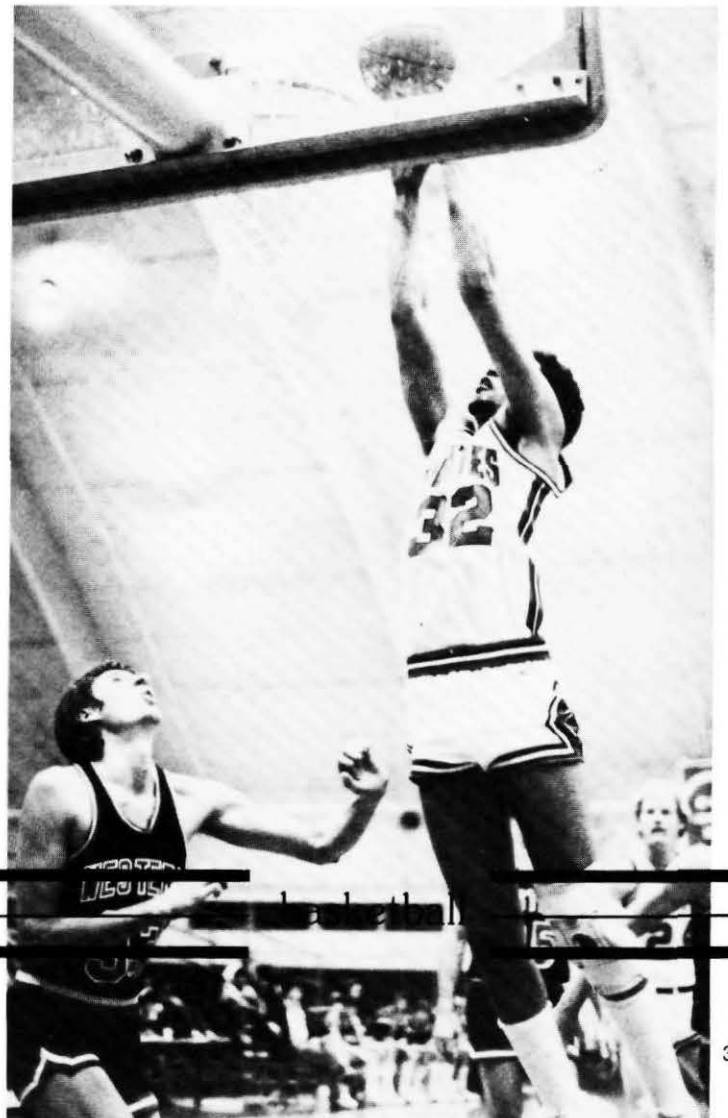

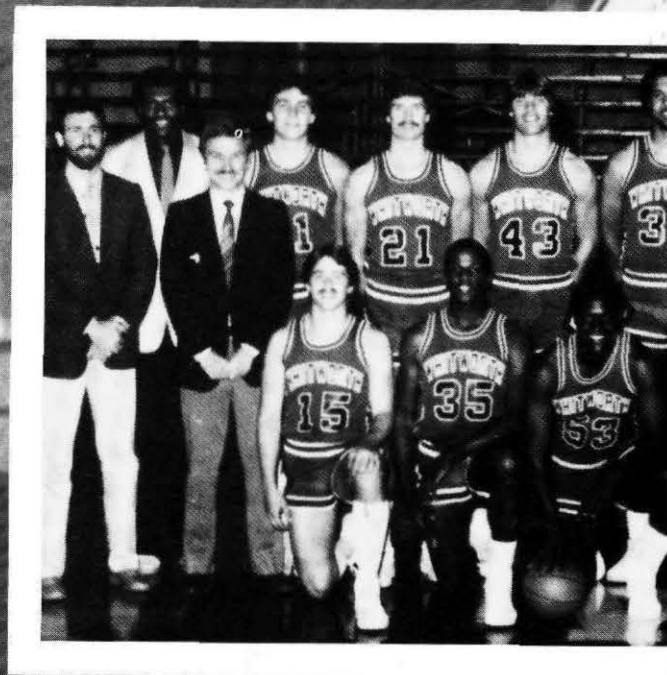


Bob Mandeville adds two more to his season point total.



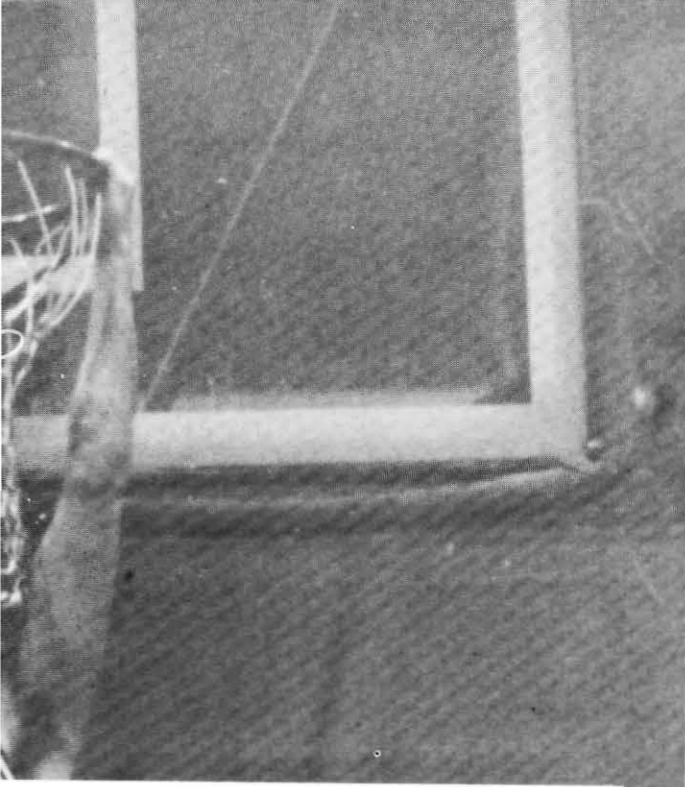

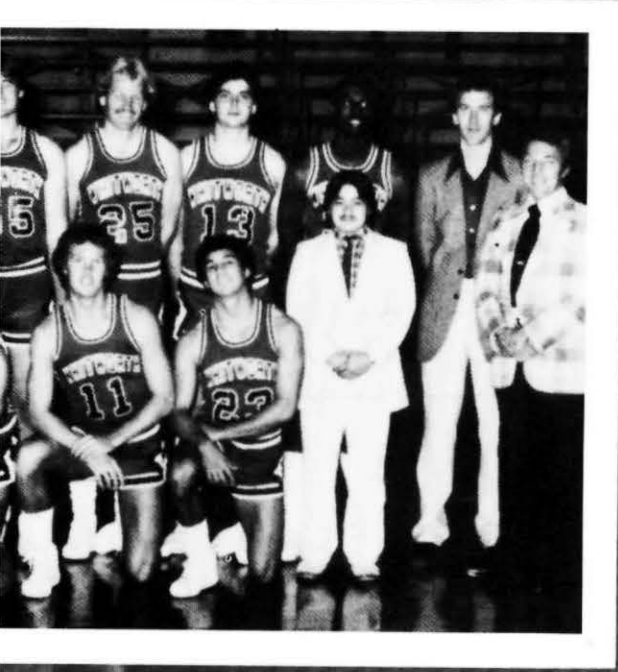

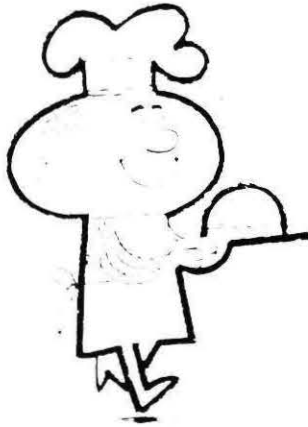

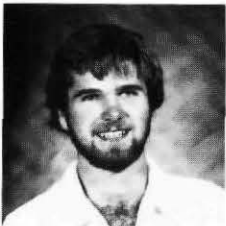
"When there was a job to be done, these guys got it done!" touted well known Stewart President Pete Swicker. "I'm really proud of the effort of our boys!"
