




The half time chariot race during the football game against Simon Fraser was a high light of the week. The Warrens came in first place.









## Football

Stacked with young players and raw talent, the Bucs matured throughout the season and laid the foundation for the future. The Whitworth football team finished the season on a positive note by beating Western Oregon 26.8. They ended with a 3.6 overall record, and 2.4 in the Mount Rainer League. 




## **Cross Country**








## • Swimming




