Special reservations will be made made for Civil War Veterans both Blue and Grey, Boy Scouts, Knapp Chorus and Y. M. C. A.

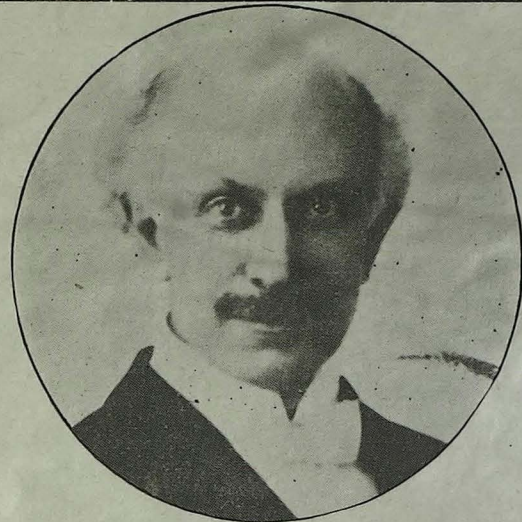
