Likenesses of Two Spokane People Appear in Issue of Leslie's.

Spokane is featured on the "People Talked About" page of Leslie's Weekly for July 24. The number contains likenesses of both Mayor W. J. Hindley and Mrs. John Bruce Dod of this city.

The mayor is grouped with the band of Blackfeet Indians from Glacier park who were her during the Pow Wow. The picture was taken in his office at the city hall.

The picture of Mrs. Dodd, with her little son, occupies a prominent position on the page. The Spokane woman is given credit for founding Father's day, which is being widely celebrated as a result of her activity.
