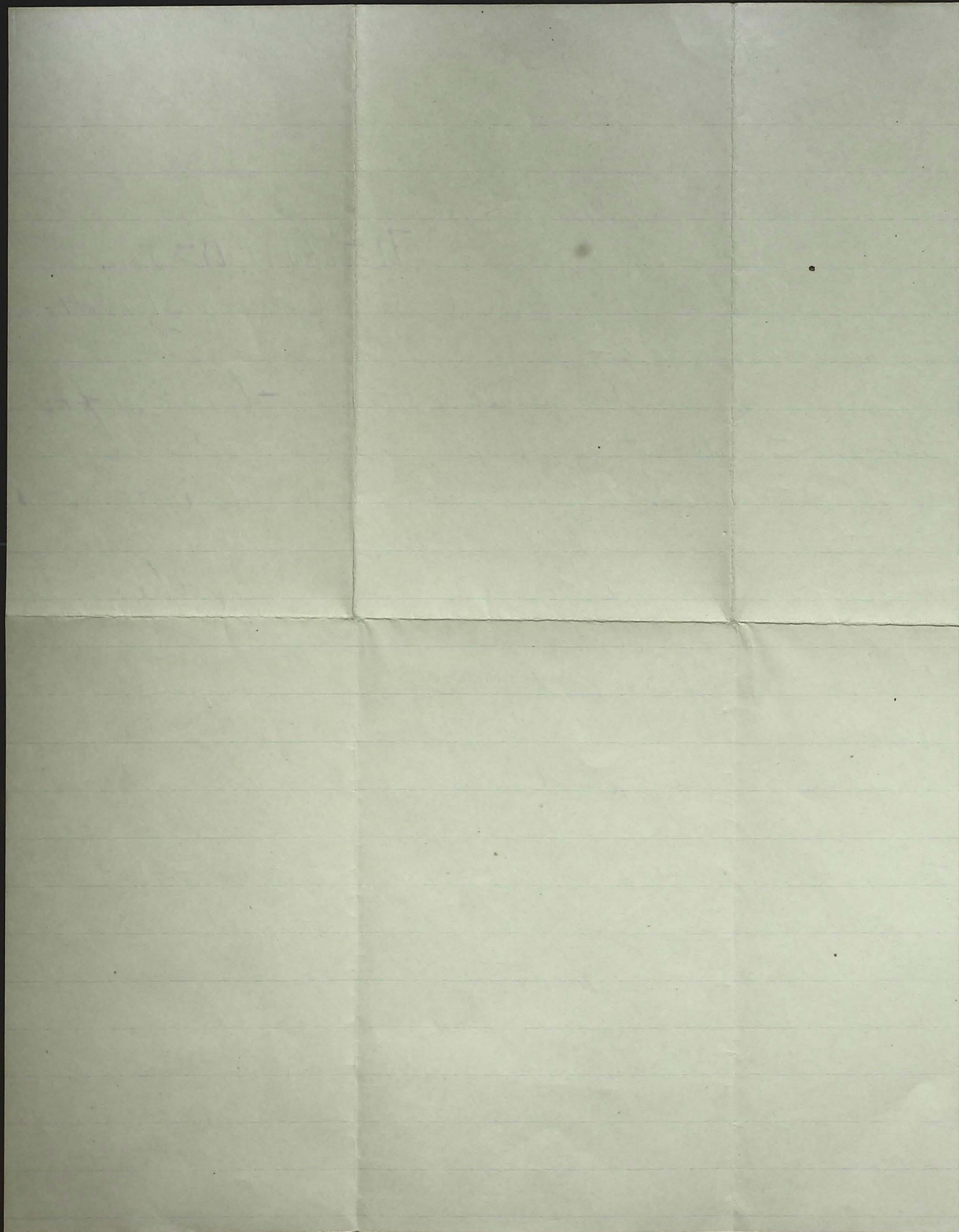
Dear Mrs. Dodd: -

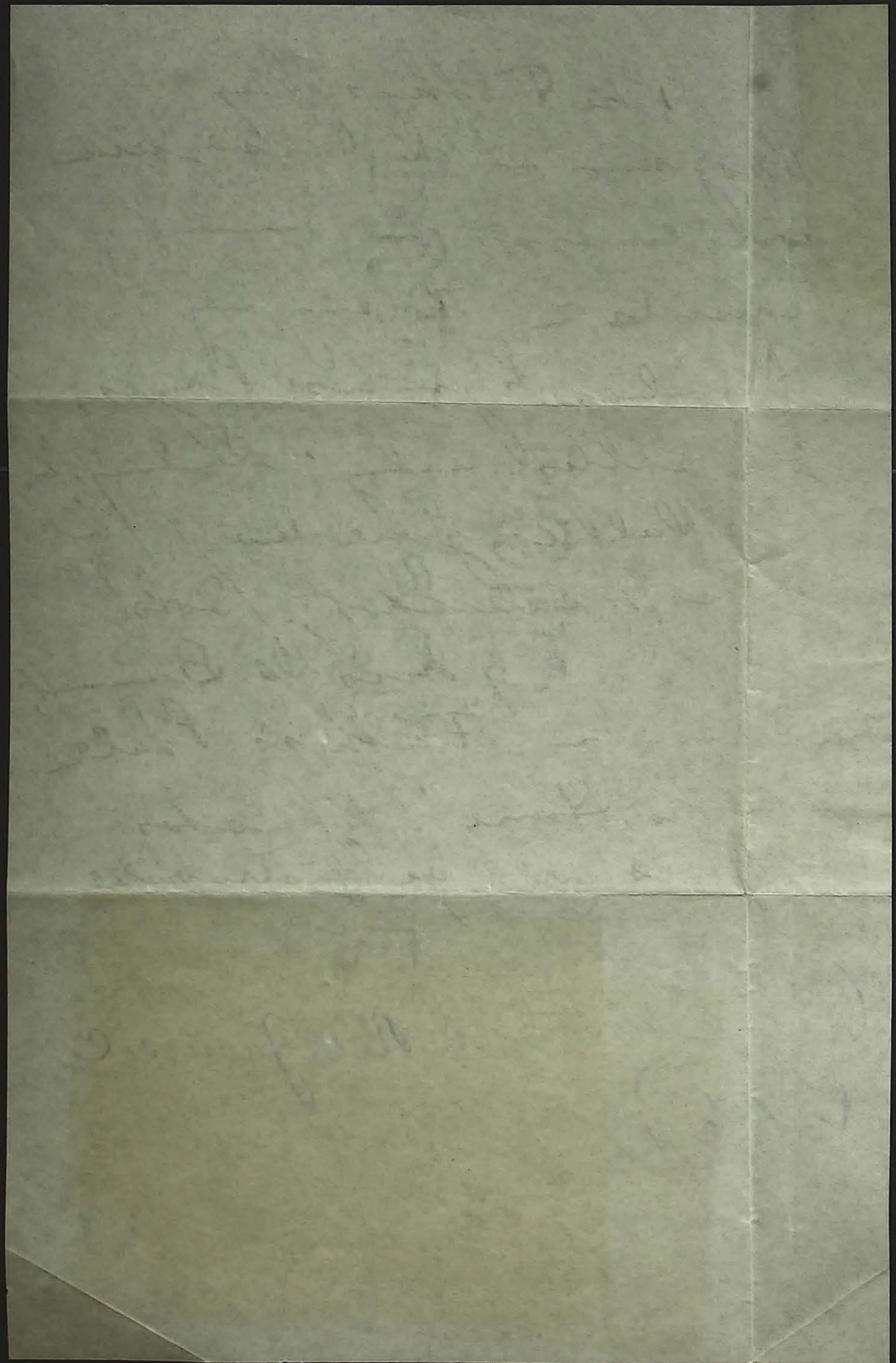
