I, LEONARD FUNK, as Mayor of the City of Spokane, do hereby proclaim Sunday, June 19, 1932, FATHER'S DAY. Observance in the broadest sense is urged as especially appropriate this year when a period of months has been set aside during which the Nation at large is commemorating the bi-centennial birth anniversary of the Father of our country.

FATHER'S DAY, although now a national institution, was inaugurated in Spokane, and this city therefore takes extraordinary pride in expressing on this day our remembrance of the sacrifices and devotion of all the fathers of the land.

Dated this 15th day of June, 1932.
