# FATHERS' DAY TO BE OBSERVED SUNDAY

For Fifth Year, Since Mrs. John Bruce  
Dodd of Spokane, Wash., Estab-  
lished the Custom—Wear a  
Red Rose.

Tomorrow will be the fifth anniversary of the establishment in this country of what is known as Father's Day. Mrs. John Bruce Dodd of Spokane, Wash., is the originator of the idea of setting apart one day in the year in honor of father, and her idea immediately took form in moving across the country, and this year Germany, Sweden, Korea, Japan and many foreign countries will be found observing the day.

Father is honored in a very simple way. Wearing a red rose will signify the proper honor given father, and in most pulpits on Sunday mention is made of the name, and some time is given to a discussion of father's place in the world. The red rose is worn to denote a living father, and a white rose, the same as worn on Mother's day, is generally worn to denote a father that has passed away.

In some instances, as a humorous side of the feature day, father is allowed certain privileges that on other days he is denied. He is given freedom to smoke in the house, to sit all day with his feet higher than his head, should he so choose.

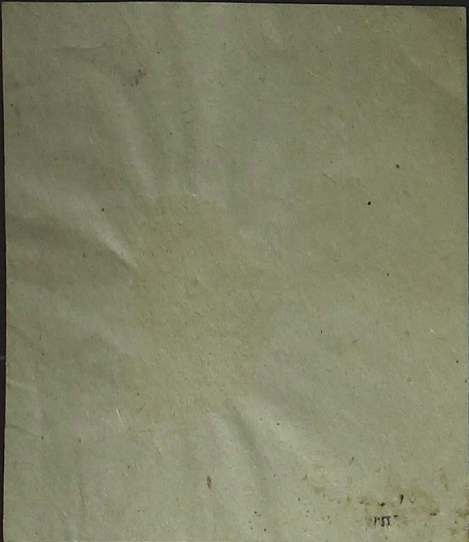
