FATHERS' DAY IS MARKED AT Y.M.C.A

Dr. D. F. Fox Tells of the Ideal Relation Between Father and Son.

With the members of the G. A. R. post as the guests of honor, Fathers' day was celebrated at the Y. M. C. A. yesterday afternoon, Dr. D. F. Fox delivering the address. Dr. Fox spoke on the relations between father and son, making many telling points.

"There are four steps to the downfall of a young man," he said, "when he know that his own conclusions are correct, when he knows it all, when he ceases to be devout, and when he rebels against his father and mother. Tell me the class of young men a boy spends his vacations with, give me a photograph of the people he would like to be like, and will tell you which way he is traveling.

"There is nothing sadder than for a father to be out of touch, out of fellowship, and out of sympathy with his bay. Fathers should never forget that they were once boys themselves, and should be interested in the things that interest their boys.

"An ideal boy will be devout, reverent, gracious and courteous, particularly in regard to women. An ideal young man never treats another fellow's sister as he would not like to have the other fellow treat his own sister.

"A father should be in love with his son, and model his love on the mother-love, which, no matter how far a boys goes into a 'far country,' is enduring and strong. Be your boy's best friend when he needs a friend.

"The ideal father will be a man whose example to his son will be one to keep the boy straight. A boy may go off at a tangent, but if his father and mother keep true, and help him, he will be brought back."

The G. A. R. men marched to the meeting to the music of the fife and drum corps, and had special seats reserved for them.

Miss Margaret McKee of Los Angeles whistled several selections. Assistant Secretary J. L. Graham led the music and W. N. Godber presided. William Cooper read the Scripture lesson, and Rev. B. B. Jacques led in prayer.

A large number of men and boys attended the meeting.
