So glad to know that the card case reached you alright.

Since visiting your family, I realize only too well the terrible suspense your parents endured. I wrote 3 letters, but apparently none of the three reached them. So I have been constrained to write again as much as I can remember of Hazel's last months, weeks, days & hours & good minutes & sent it to Mr Pritchard. Since I feel that I know Hazel better than any one else, it seemed a real duty. He may use it at the dedication of the Memorial Organ & then may be your parents would like to keep it. Hazel was a real missionary & her remains lying in that corner of the compound so clearly Conced Stier speaks to many at Pheasant. My one grief is that I cannot do justice to the subject.

We are settling in here very nicely, any time you or any of Hazel's family should

happen an way, I trust you will look
upon this as Schell's name & treat it
accordingly.
