Tomorrow, Sunday, June 21, will be Father's day. Many have protested that poor old father can worry along very well without a day, but the movement started in Spokane, Washington, five years ago by Mrs. John Bruce Dodd, has now been officially recognized by both houses of congress and the anniversary will be observed in enough cities to make it a national festival. It should not be overlooked in New Castle by the thousands who remember "Father" but who gave him scant appreciation when he was alive.

The father's day movement has even spread beyond our shores. It has been taken up in Germany, Sweden, Korea, Japan, Mexico, Hawaii, Canada and India.

To observe Father's day one has only to wear a cluster of red and white roses in the button hole or at the corsage on the third Sunday in June.

It is the beloved father who has passed this life rather than the living father who is commemorated.

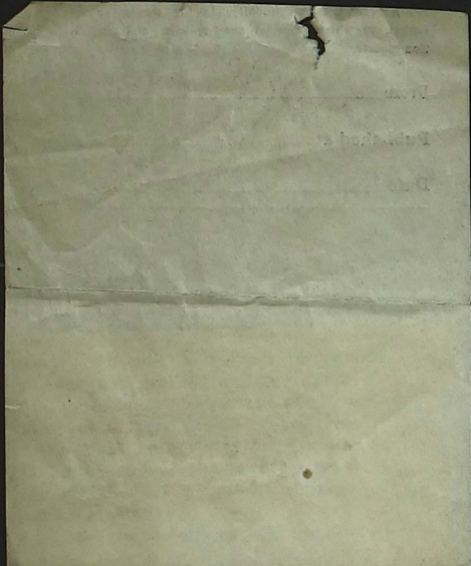
