POKE all the fun you wish, but
father will have his day.

Fathers' day is tomorrow.

Everybody who has respect for
dad is expected to wear a rose.

It makes no difference what
kind of a rose is worn. Father
is not particular. But a rose
should be worn.

The first suggestion that a day
should be set apart each year for
the showing of affection to fath-
ers was made three years ago. A
few months later Congressman J.
Hampton Moore of Pennsylvania
introduced a bill providing that
the first Sunday in June in each
year should be designated as
Father's day.

Since then the fathers in the
United States have claimed that
day as their own.

The rose, irrespective of color,
is the emblem to be worn on
Fathers' day.

Mothers' day was observed
May 14.
