"FATHER'S DAY" IS OBSERVED IN CHURCH

In order not to neglect poor father, the Baptist church celebrated "Fathers' Day" yesterday with a special sermon directed to men. One of the classes which is composed of men entirely came to the service in a body, fifty strong. Most of the men of the class turned out for the service.

Dr. C. E. Lapp spoke on "Face to Face," calling attention to the great responsibility which men must face in the world. He pointed out that religion was no longer a woman's job, but was a task which men must take upon their shoulders. He showed the development already along this line, citing as an instance the big brother movements which are connected with many churches.
