Who organized the first woman's club? Who is the mother of this great federated body of women? The honor is sought for two women, Mrs. Constance Owen Fauntleroy, of New Harmony, Ind., and Jennie June Croly, of New York. At the centennial celebration held in New Harmony last year evidence was said to prove that the first club in America was organized in New Harmony, and was a parliamentary law club.
