American Motherhood Magazine Features Work of Mrs. Dixon, Spokane.

"Father's Day" article written by Esther Hall Dixon (Mrs. Karl Hale Dixon), of W906 Fifteenth avenue, is one of the chief features in the June number of the American Motherhood magazine.

"The idea of a Father's day was conceived by Mrs. John Bruce Dodd of Spokane, in 1909, and in 1910 her suggestion in the form of a petition was submitted, to and duly adopted by the Spokane Ministerial association. The petition pointed out the meaning which such a day would have from both a religious and patriotic point of view if generally observed and recommended that the city pulpits adopt the plan."
