# GOV. GOODRICH TO SPEAK HERE NEXT SUNDAY

State Executive Accepts Invitation  
to Attend "Father's Day" at  
High Street M. E. Church.

## BIG PROGRAM ARRANGED

Word was received in Muncie, Wednesday morning by Dr. J. W. McMillan, chairman of the committee of the men's class of the High Street M. E. church, that Governor James P. Goodrich had accepted an invitation to be present Sunday morning next at the "Fathers' Day" services at the church. The governor will bring along with him the Sunday school class taught by him at Winchester. Governor Goodrich will teach this class at 9:30 Sunday morning at the High Street M. E. church, and will address the Sunday school at the conclusion of the lesson.

Dr. J. W. McMillan, with F. F. Kerwood, John George, G. D. Foreman, G. C. Cavanaugh and O. M. Dick, the committee, knowing that Governor Goodrich taught a class at Indianapolis and a class at Winchester on alternate Sundays, selected Sunday next for the invitation as they knew the governor would be at Winchester. Dr. McMillan got in touch with Frank Litschert, formerly of The Muncie Press staff, and through his offices, the invitation was laid before the state executive and was accepted. A unique program is being arranged for the reception of Governor Goodrich in this city.

At 7 o'clock Sunday morning four buglers will ascend to the belfry of the church where they will sound calls in four different directions. They will then proceed to the street and sound the calls at the corner of the church. The buglers will proceed in an auto all over the city. After this, an instrumental quartet will perform patriotic airs in the belfry of the church from 9 o'clock to 9:30. A reception to Governor Goodrich and his Winchester class will follow. The Sunday school program will consist chiefly of patriotic music and songs under the direction of John George.
