In U. S. to Save Mrs. Napolitano



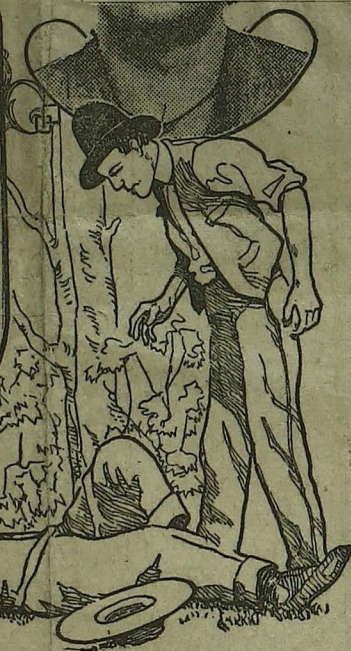
MRS. JOHN DODD.
