Many boys on the battle fields are turning to our Father Which art in Heaven, and this Fathers's Day takes on a new significance for them.

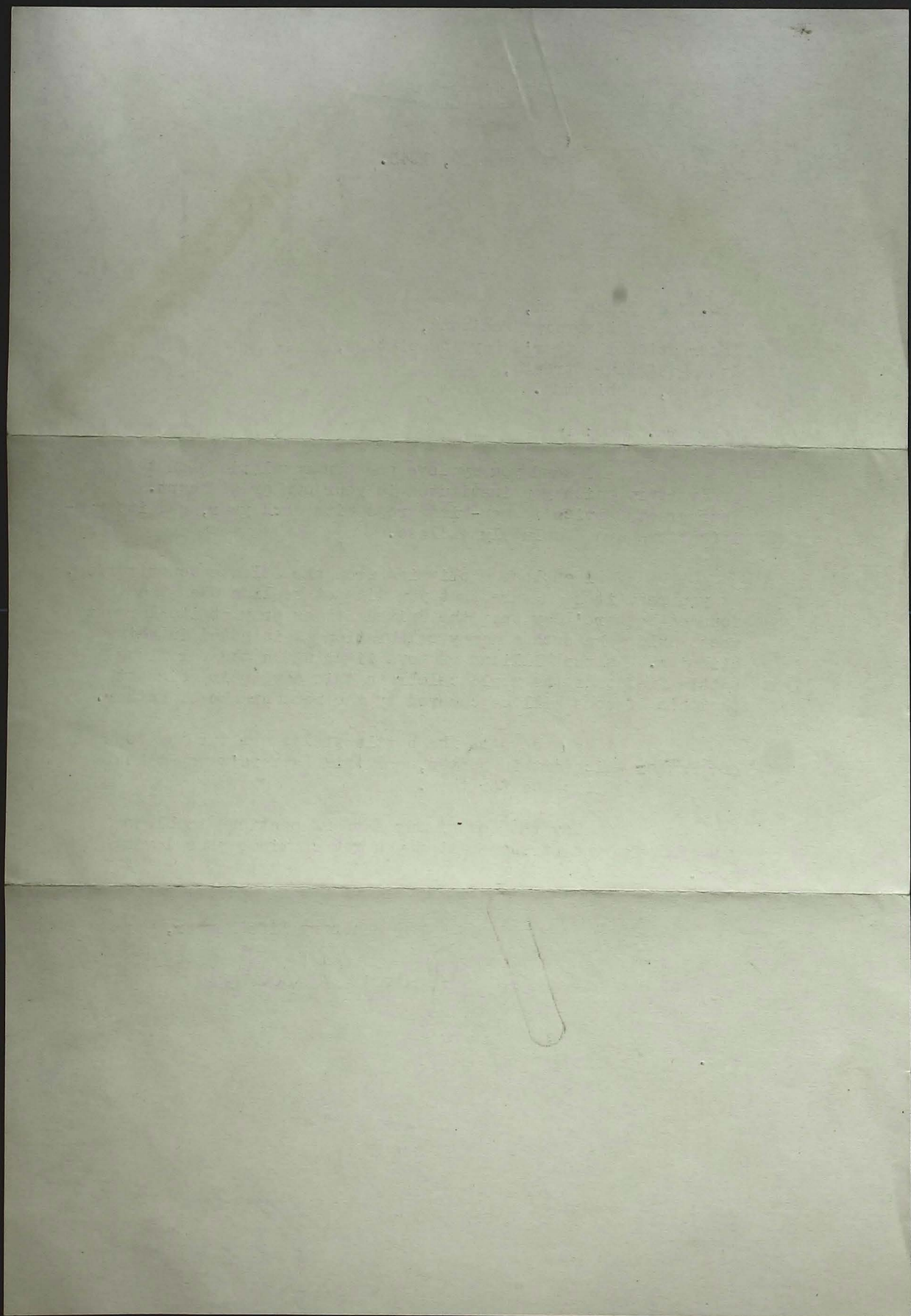
May the God of our Fathers continue to bless you and make you strong so that you may continue your loving work.

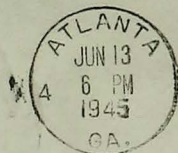
