Before the Double Ten all the institutions will leave here soon.

Will you write me and please send your letter to Hafei? My address is:

The money (Chinese \$ 30000) you sent Mr. Wong was received. He is there now. What should I do with the money? God bless you!

Did you receive the letters through air in the spring? I long for your letter all the time. Now the Japanese is submitted. The final victory is ours. Wish you happy! Our ^{fellow} country men are obliged to you very much. We appreciate your friendship greatly. Now the government of Anhwei is preparing to move back to the original place. The head of the People's affair, Mr. Wei told me that I better hurry to Hefei to rearrange the hospital. I didn't do that. I would not do anything until your order comes. You better send your words by telegraph. I am wishing for your returning to China.
