
This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of June, 2, requesting that the Father's Day slogan "Honon ThyFather" be included hereafter in our telegrams.

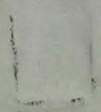
