P R O C L A M A T I O N

WHEREAS, the third Sunday in June, which this year is June 18, is nationally commemorated as FATHER'S DAY, and observance is especially fitting in the city of its origin;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Neal R. Fosseen, Mayor of the City of Spokane, State of Washington, do hereby proclaim Sunday, June 18, 1961, to be known as
