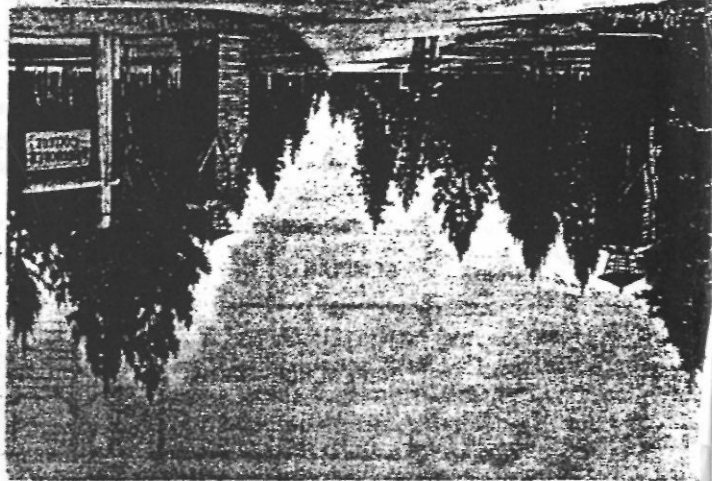

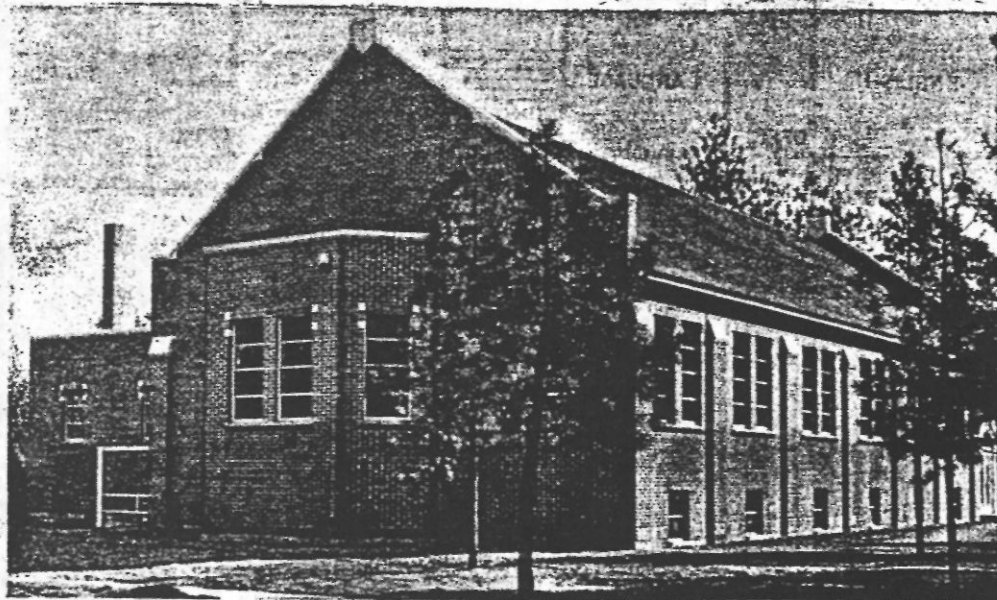

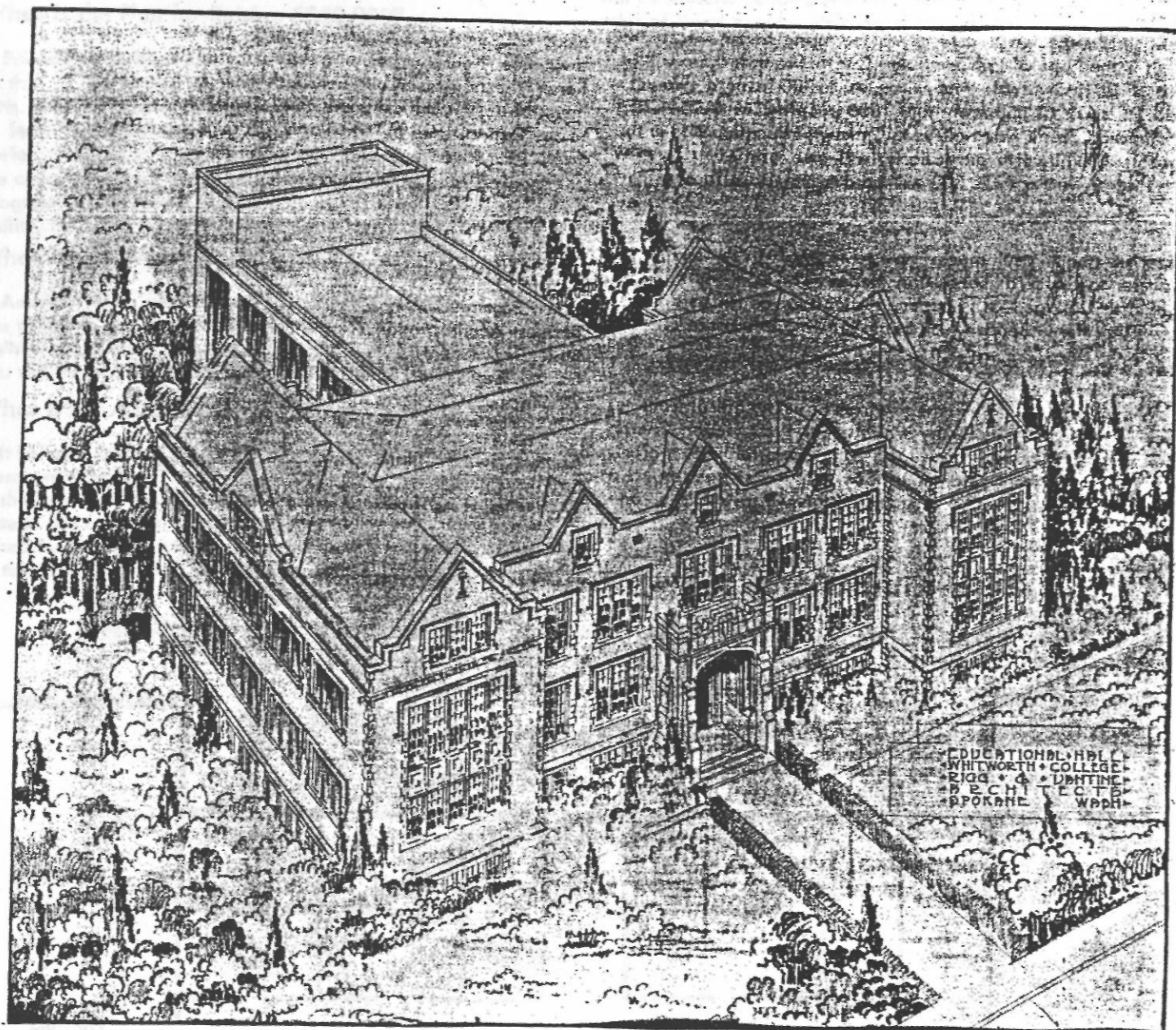

# WHITWORTH COLLEGE BUILDS FOR TOMORROW

Since Pearl Harbor Whitworth has been building, preparing for its greatest service in our post-war days. Because of a student body which has increased 100 per cent in recent years and because the College must be prepared soon for a permanent student body of at least six hundred students, the educational facilities of the College must be enlarged. An EDUCATIONAL HALL must be provided to house a library and stacks for 60,000 books, an auditorium to seat a thousand, twenty to twenty-five classrooms, a home economics department, and ample administrative offices. Such a building will also provide some additional dormitory space by releasing the first floors of McMillan and Ballard Halls now serving as classrooms.

## GOAL OF \$350,000 SET

Such a project involves not only the building of a fireproof building at an estimated cost of \$250,000, but also necessitates the construction of a central heating plant and the remodeling of our present buildings. It is the desire of the Board of Education of the Presbyterian Church and of the Board of Trustees of the College that \$50,000 of the total amount be set aside for the endowment or maintenance of this new Educational Hall. Construction will begin as soon as funds and materials are available.

### What Is the Financial Condition of Whitworth?

Total assets in buildings, real estate and equipment are approximately \$750,000. The College runs on a balanced budget — all salaries and bills are paid monthly and there is no indebtedness.

### What Is the Plan for Raising \$350,000?

Friends of Christian Education will give gladly to such a cause as this. It is expected that there will be many large, substantial gifts. It is the hope of the Campaign Committee that there will be at least 100 individuals who will give \$1000 over a two-year period. It is just as important that 1000 people give \$100 during the campaign. If all who believe in Christian Education and in the program of Whitworth particularly, will give according to their ability, the drive for \$350,000 will be a tremendous success.

### What About War Bonds?

America needs your money now — we shall need it later. If you prefer to buy War Bonds buy Series F, or G, in the name of "Whitworth College." It is our suggestion that as far as possible you will buy the G Bonds which begin drawing interest at once.

### What Is the Attitude of the Synod of Washington?

It believes unreservedly in the program of its Synodical College. Plans are now being made by which every Presbyterian Church in the Synod of Washington will have an opportunity to participate in the raising of this amount. Some Churches already have asked for their quota and without doubt this will prove to be one of the greatest sources of income.

### Education Hall a Memorial Building.

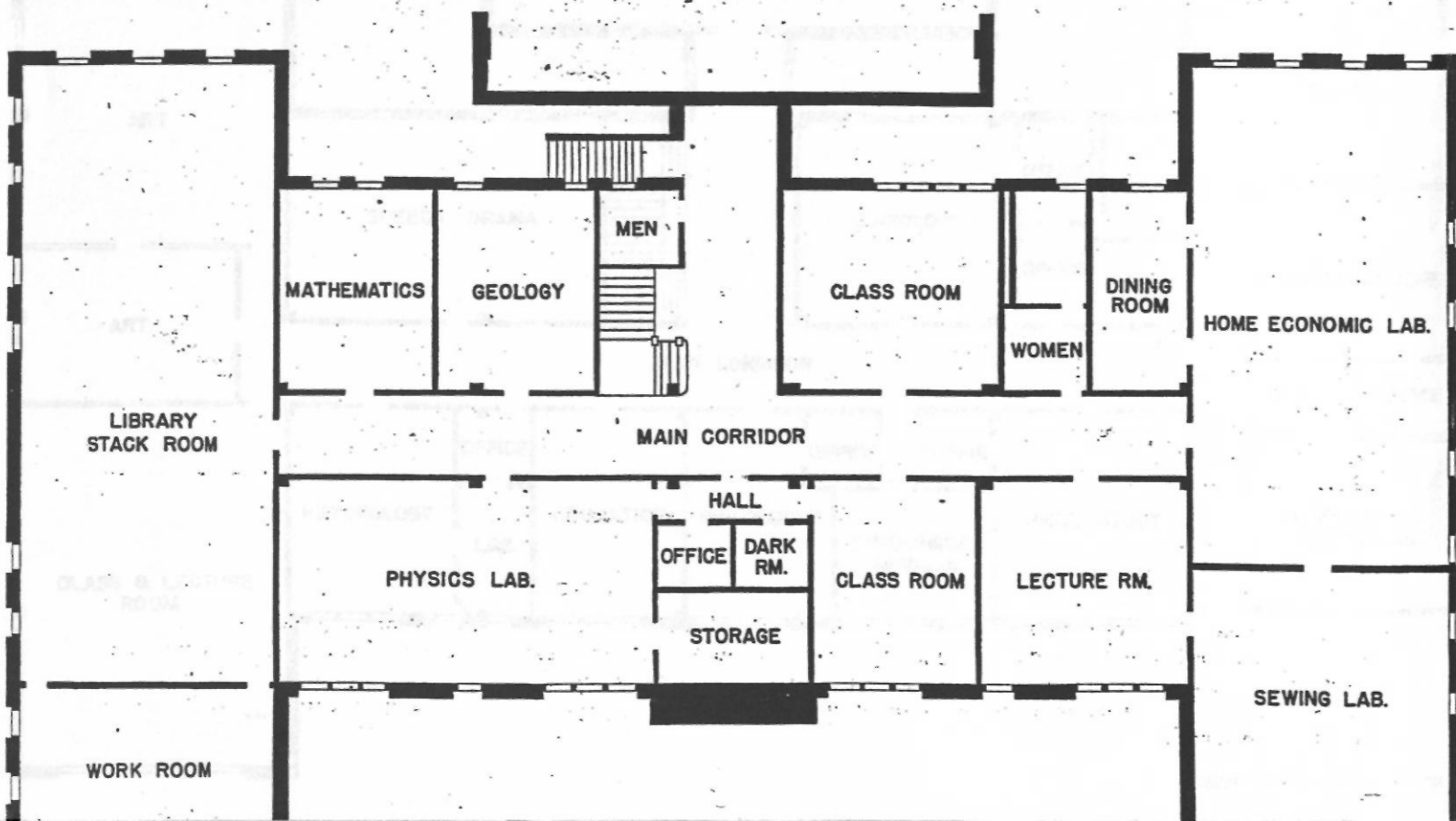

This "Memorial Building" will be a useful building — a living memorial — living in the memories of living people. Its construction will mean that henceforth the educational need of 500 to 600 young people will be met. This proposed building is not only practical but beautiful; spacious and modern. An investment in Christian education pays dividends. Your investment in this Memorial Building will not only honor the names of our hundreds now in the service but will mean above all, the continuation of Christian education according to the pattern here at Whitworth. Through a memorial at Whitworth your loved ones shall live on in memory.

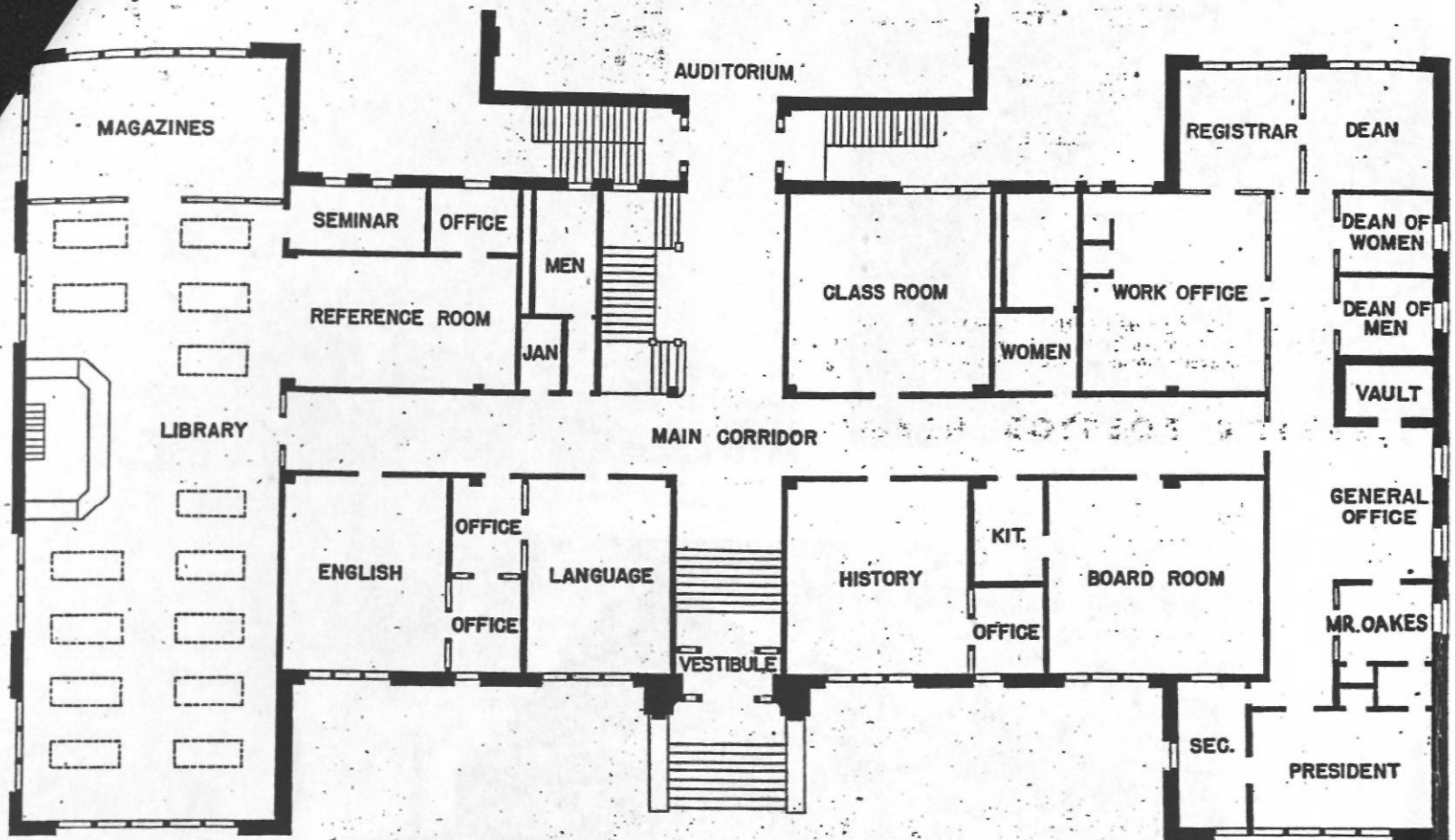
