A BIRD IN THE HAND

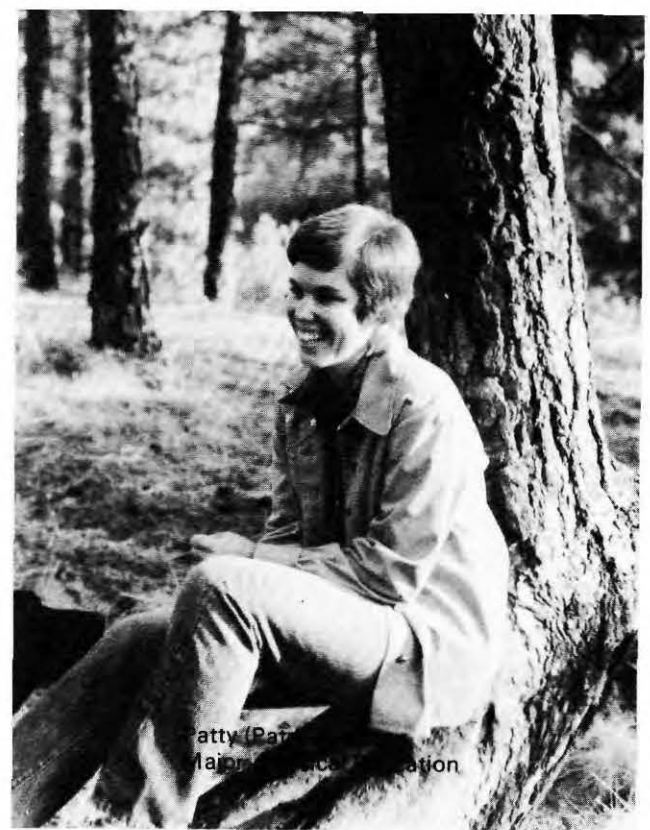
A bird on the top of a telephone pole

points to a need to think this one over.

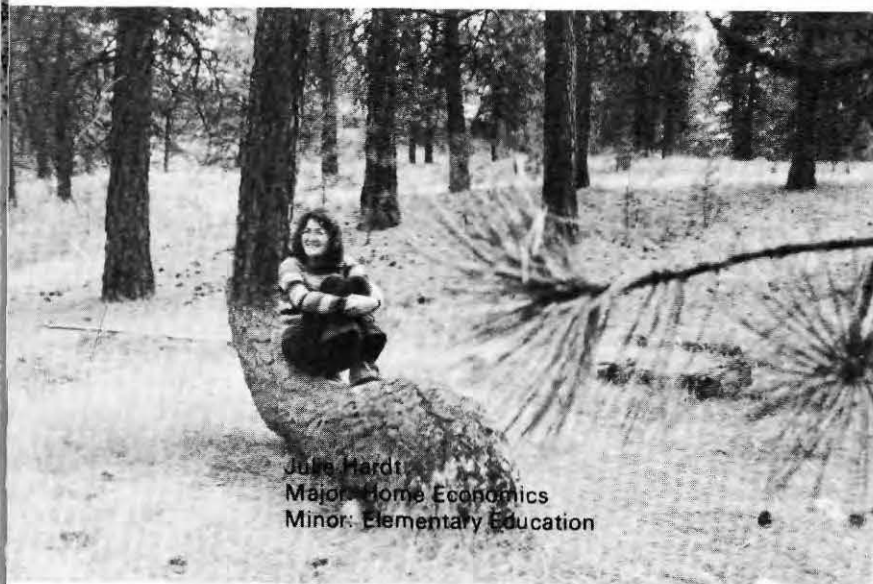
A bristle-thighed curlew or a bar-tailed godwit

Cheerleaders ... Ignite Spirit At Games; Unity Key To Success

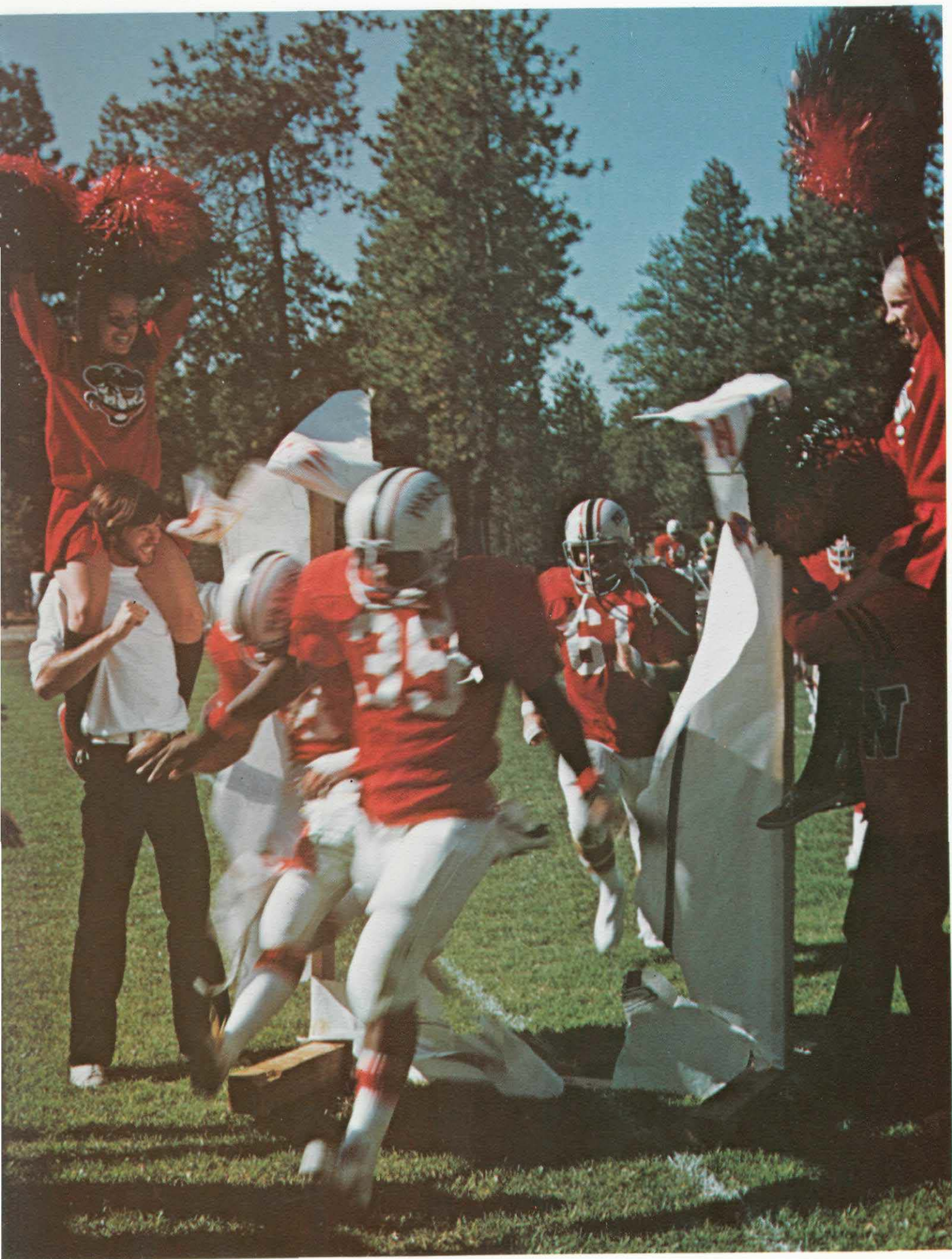

Football ... Well Rounded Team Explodes For 6-3-O Season

After the Pirrettes hand out the last program, boompunts and the voice over the PA cease to fill the crisp air, and yellow leaves replace the shredded confetti you threw at Homecoming. one wonders: What kind of season did Whitworth's gridiron Pirates encounter?

Coach Hugh Campbell related that, "Before the season began we were looking at a very tough schedule. An unusually tough year was ahead. Our first two games we were considered underdogs, and when you start a season losing your first two games it can ruin the rest of the season. Fortunately our players realized this and executed some really fine football. It was a pleasant surprise to win those first two.

"At the beginning of the year a 6-3 season wouldn't have sounded bad, but those three were so close, we realize we could have done better.

"For example, the Willamette loss was a nightmare. We were knocking on their goal line the whole game and then we would fumble or something and never get across.

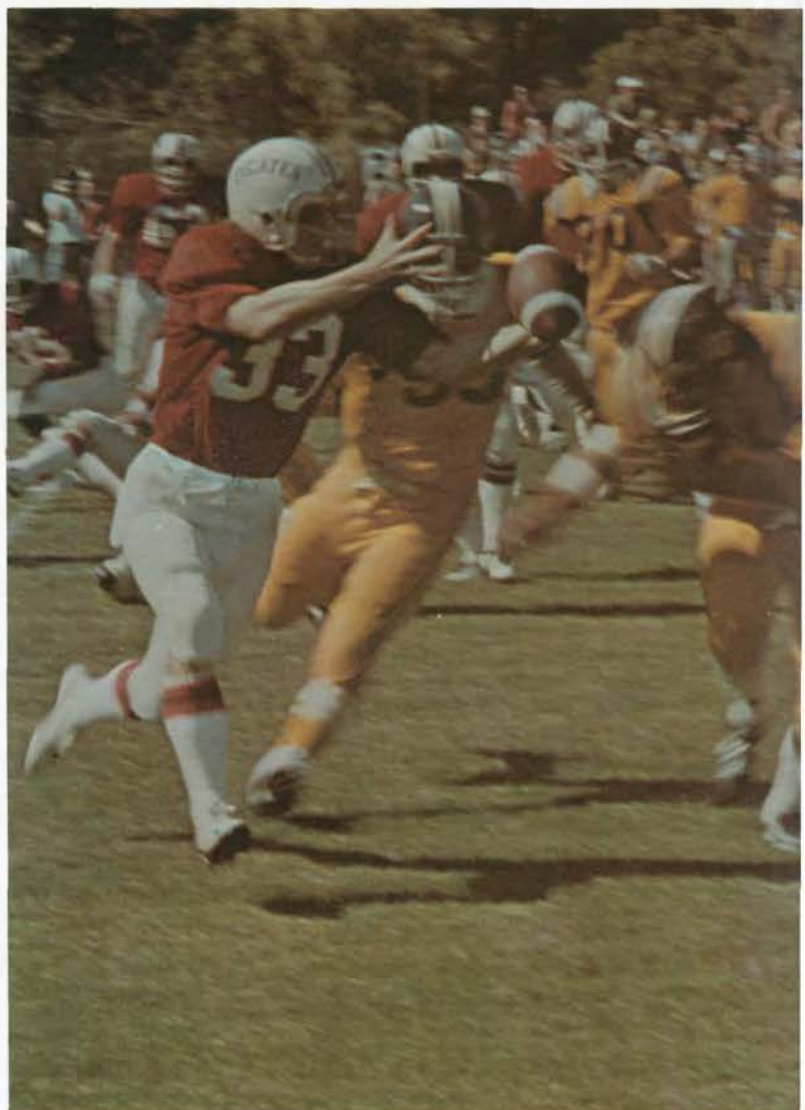

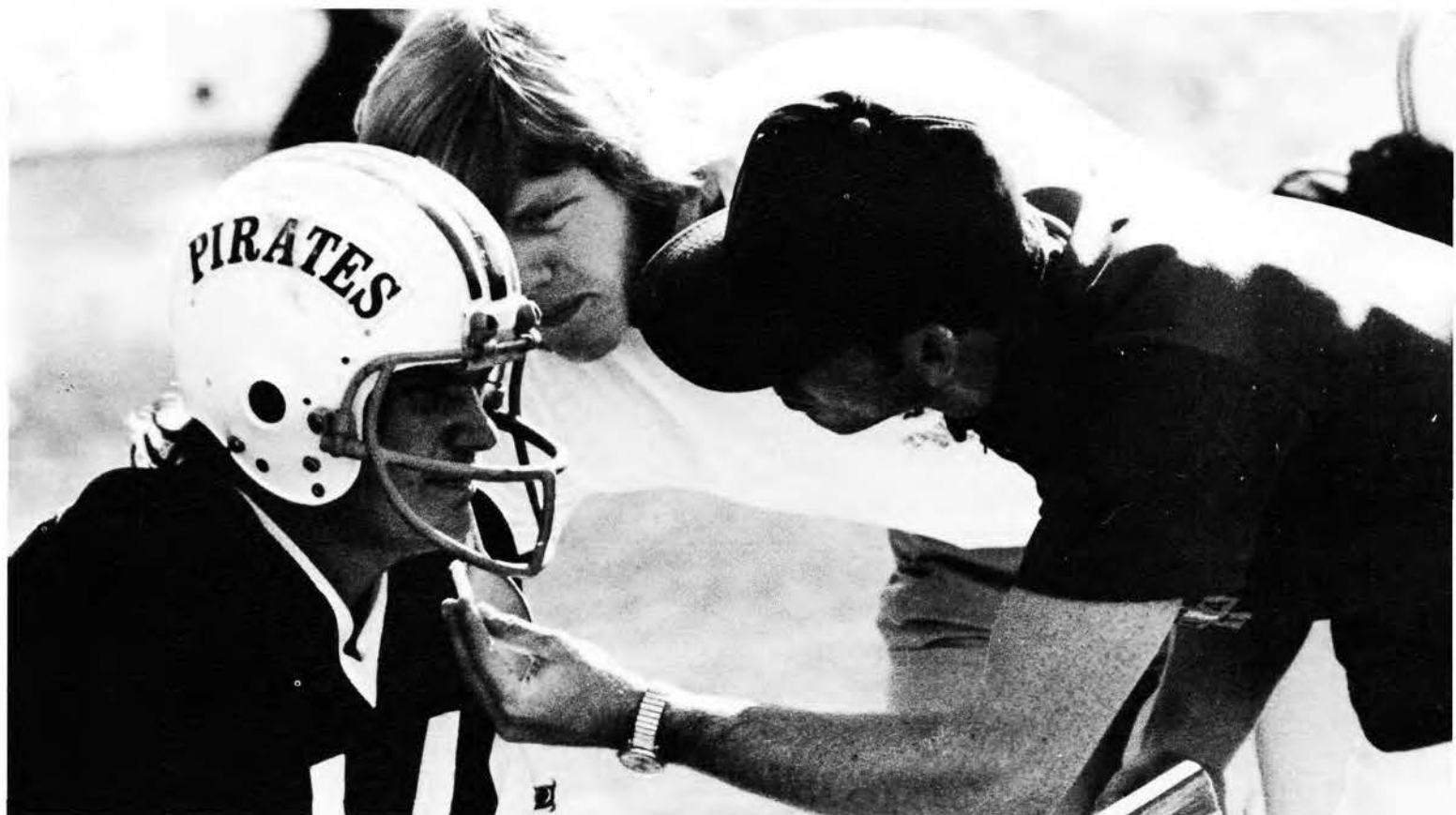

"You have to give the other team credit. They caused us to fumble and stopped us from crossing the goal line, but at the same time we were down there so much the law of averages indicates we should have scored at least once—but we didn't. I think Linfield was the toughest team we played. They had the biggest and strongest line. They were the toughest physically, but PLU presented a real problem for us with their strategy—primarily a lot of reverses. I would rate both of these teams above the rest in the league."

Football at most colleges is just comprised of a 'win at all costs' attitude. The aspects that Campbell and his staff focus on are the improvements in the individuals. "We're trying to present football as a medium where people with certain athletic skills can demonstrate those skills but also can use the sport of football to learn something about commitment and the relationship to hard work and results. Here at Whitworth I think a group of people doing something together and having it come out right is something we've emphasized. That doesn't mean we win every game."

Soccer ... Has First Exciting Year

The Whitworth Soccer Club was formed this year by a group of soccer enthusiasts. Even though the club wasn't recognized as a varsity sport, they competed against varsity teams in the Northwest Intercollegiate Soccer League.

The club, funded by club members obtaining donations, was coached voluntarily by Ray Fabian of the P.E. Department. Fabian has hopes that in the future the club may be considered for the varsity program at Whitworth. He stressed that, "the way we play next year, our attitudes both on and off the field and whether we are able to stimulate student support will be the determining factors".

Coach Fabian was also optimistic and enthusiastic about the club's first season. "I think it was a great experience because of the different styles of soccer, cultures, and personalities that had to mold together."

Since most of the members are from foreign countries where soccer is the national sport, he feels that with spring workouts and the advent of time maturing and unifying the players, they should be able to improve over this years 2-3-4 record.

Cross Country ... Places 4th In District As Zibell Goes To Nationals

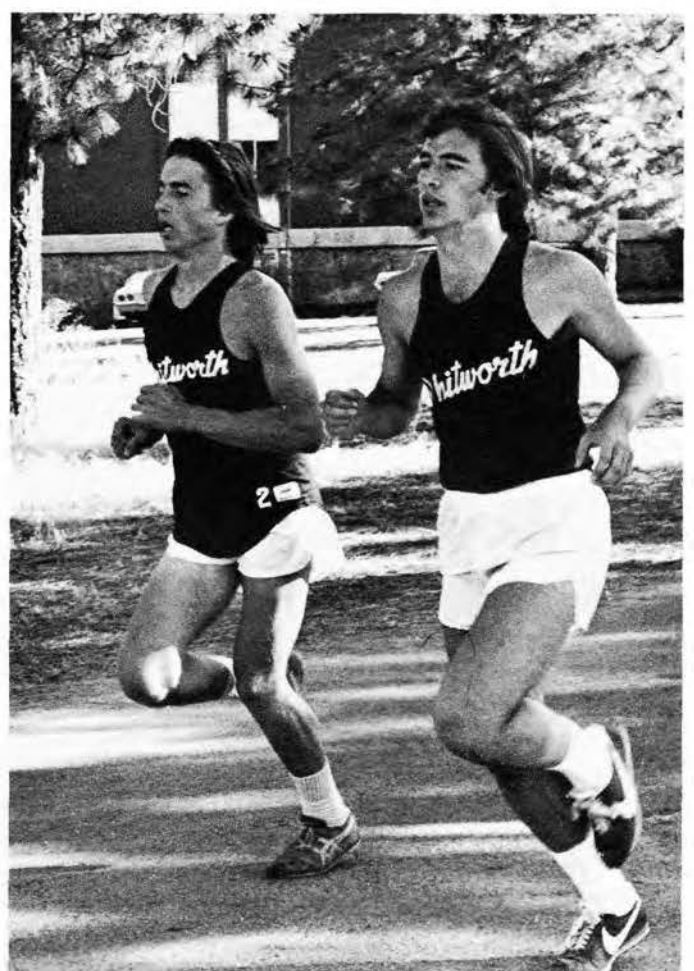
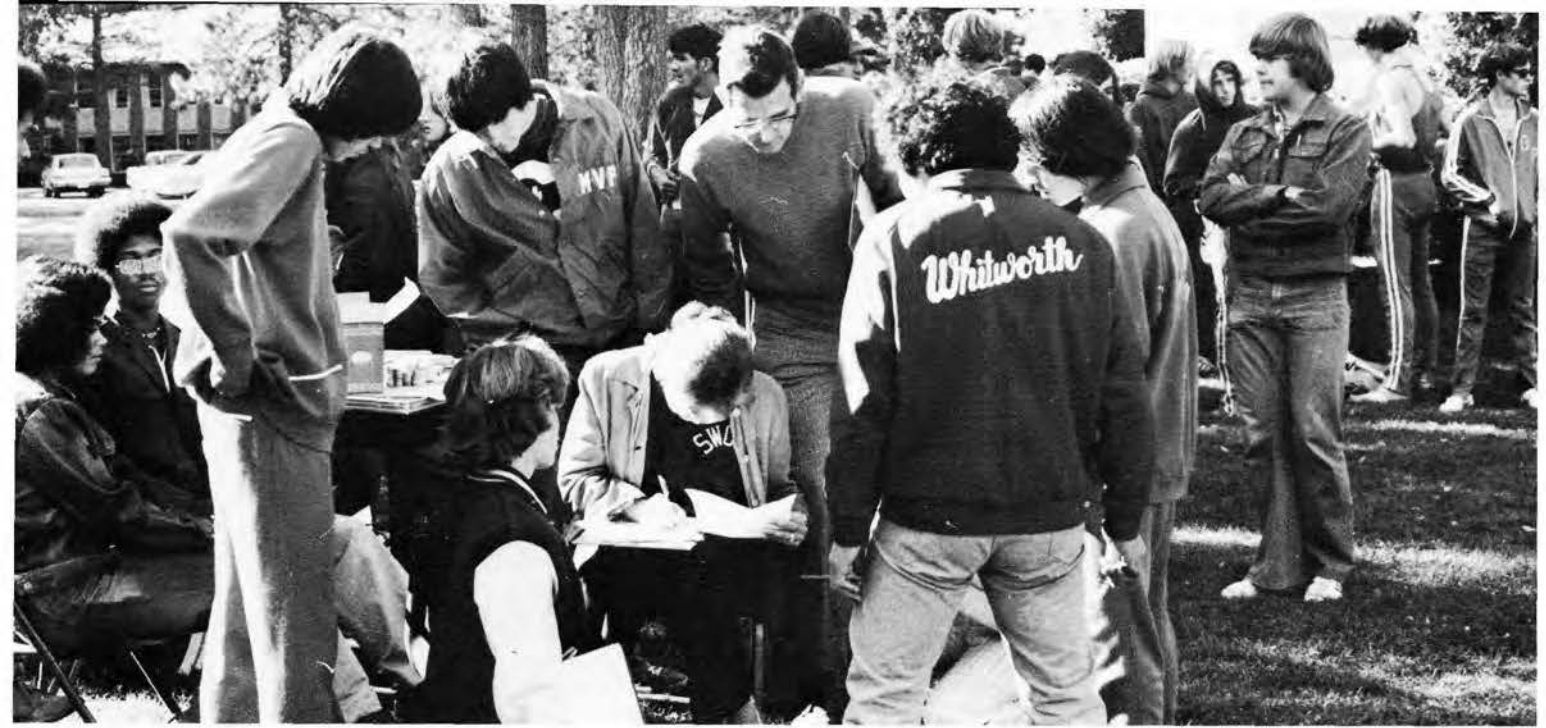

The team enjoyed a consistent season. Coach Borrevik had mixed feelings about it. "We came up with some unfortunate injuries. The way members dealt with their injuries stimulated team growth and maturity."

The team definitely had the potential for the conference championship. "This was a GOOD fourth place team," remarked Borrevik. The top four teams were bunched within a ten point spread. PLU edged out Willamette by one point for the title. Doug Zibell finished second for the Pirates in the Pacific Northwest Conference meet and a strong third in the NAIA District #1 race. Whitworth emerged in fifth place in the district meet among a field of tough competitors. Zibell then went to the National NAIA Cross Country meet in Salina, Kansas for his performance in the District NAIA meet.

Confusion marred the meet as Doug finished about 80th but was credited for 161st due to the chaos at the finish. How does it feel to compete in a National Cross Country meet? Doug said he felt "very nervous. Ah, I was asking the Lord, 'What am I doing in this place with all these people?' I'd never gone on a trip of this magnitude before. I didn't have the coach there to give me a short pep talk like when the entire team is together. In other words, I had to do it alone."

Cross Country at Whitworth is more than just an average of running forty-five miles a week in training, a five mile race over dusty trails, sand and hills every week. Coach Borrevik summed it up when he confidently said, "All your goals aren't winning."

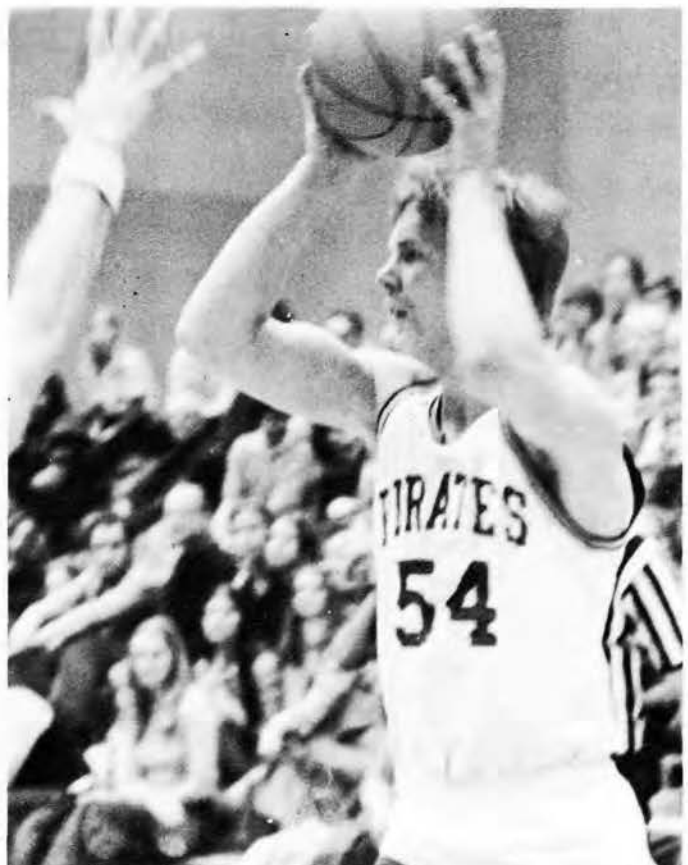

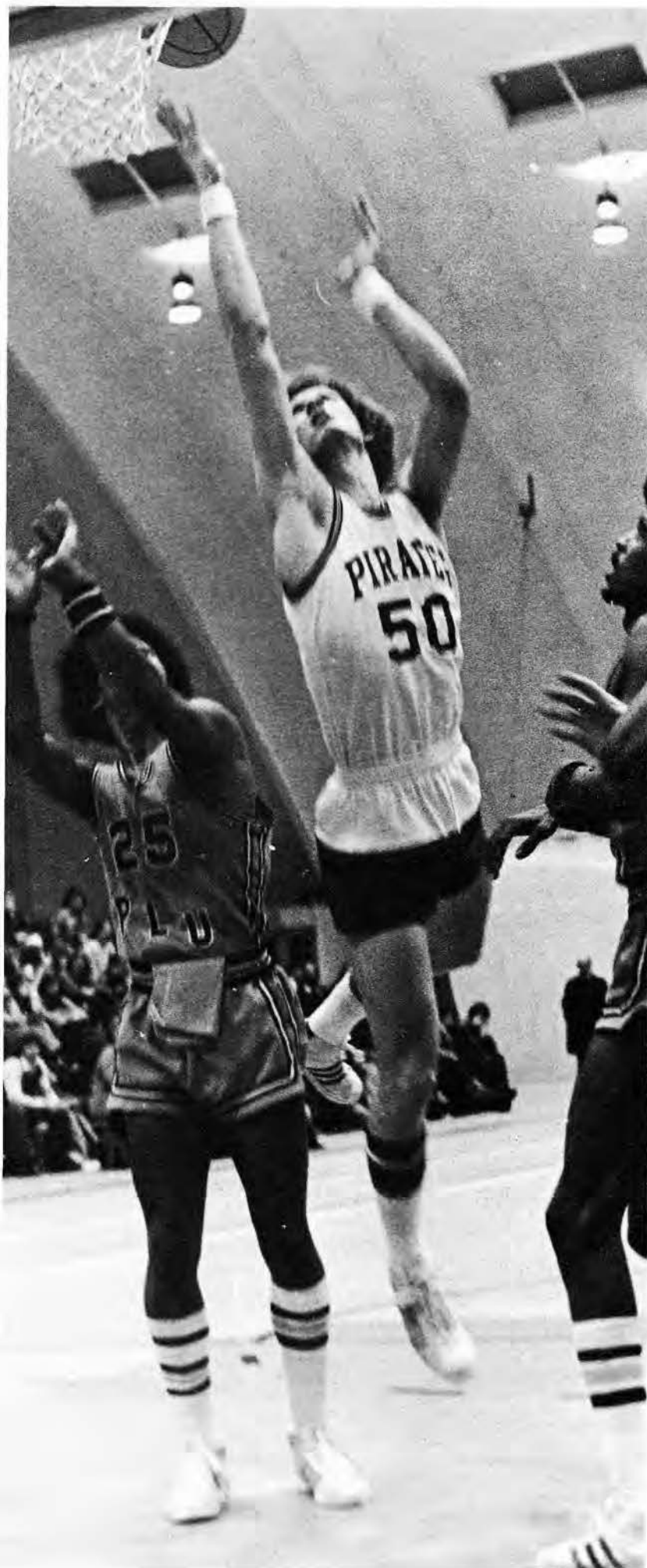
I plug in the recorder and ask my first question. "Which game do you feel was the outstanding one of the season in light of competitiveness?"

"I feel that our win over Lewis and Clark, here, at the time when L.C. was undefeated in the league was our best overall performance. The Pirates has been beaten down at Lewis and Clark pretty badly a week earlier and they bounced back and upset them."

"What attitudes do you expect from your players?"

"We work a lot on attitude. This year we had, as our motto: 'put someone up today.' Which means trying to give positive support to someone every day. Say something good about him. Give him a pat on the back; be positive.

"Another thing we do is try to always thank a guy for a good pass or a good play that helps someone else. It builds team unity and team spirit.

"Every fall in mid-November we take the team away for a retreat and we talk about attitudes. We try to preconceive the various things that will be problem areas. Like, ah, what if we aren't winning? How do we react to that? To one another, and from player to coach? We discuss it thoroughly until we get the concept that we're all in this together. It's still a different story when you go from theory to real life experience. Hopefully, you'll react the way you said you would"

"Were any goals set at the start of the season?"

"At the retreat we set long-range goals. One of the things that was discouraging about this season was that we didn't live up to these goals. We didn't come anywhere near them, one of which was to win 20 games. We won nine, out of twenty-six. Other goals we set were things such as to get more rebounds than our opponents. We came close to fulfilling that one.

"Our central goal was this: We are a super dedicated team that enjoys playing together and positively supporting one another. This was an affirmation that we were a together team, striving to accomplish all our other goals."

The interview is over. I leave the office, the blackboard with it's years of experience, the yellowing photographs, and the trophies, realizing that for Cal Riemcke basketball is more than a game. It's a lesson in life.

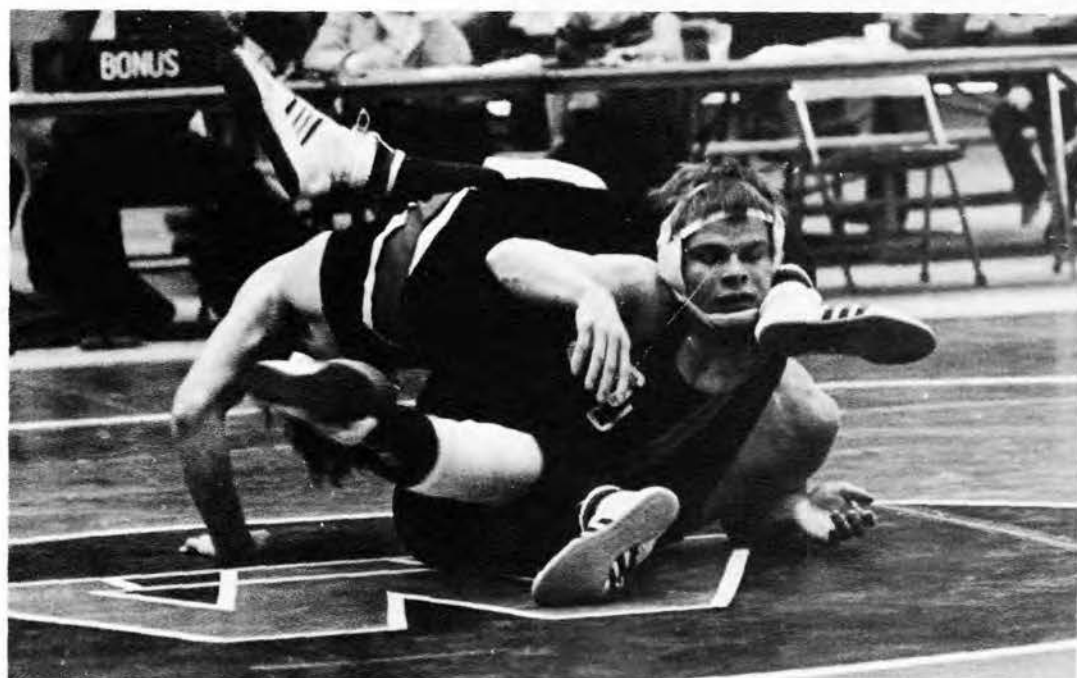

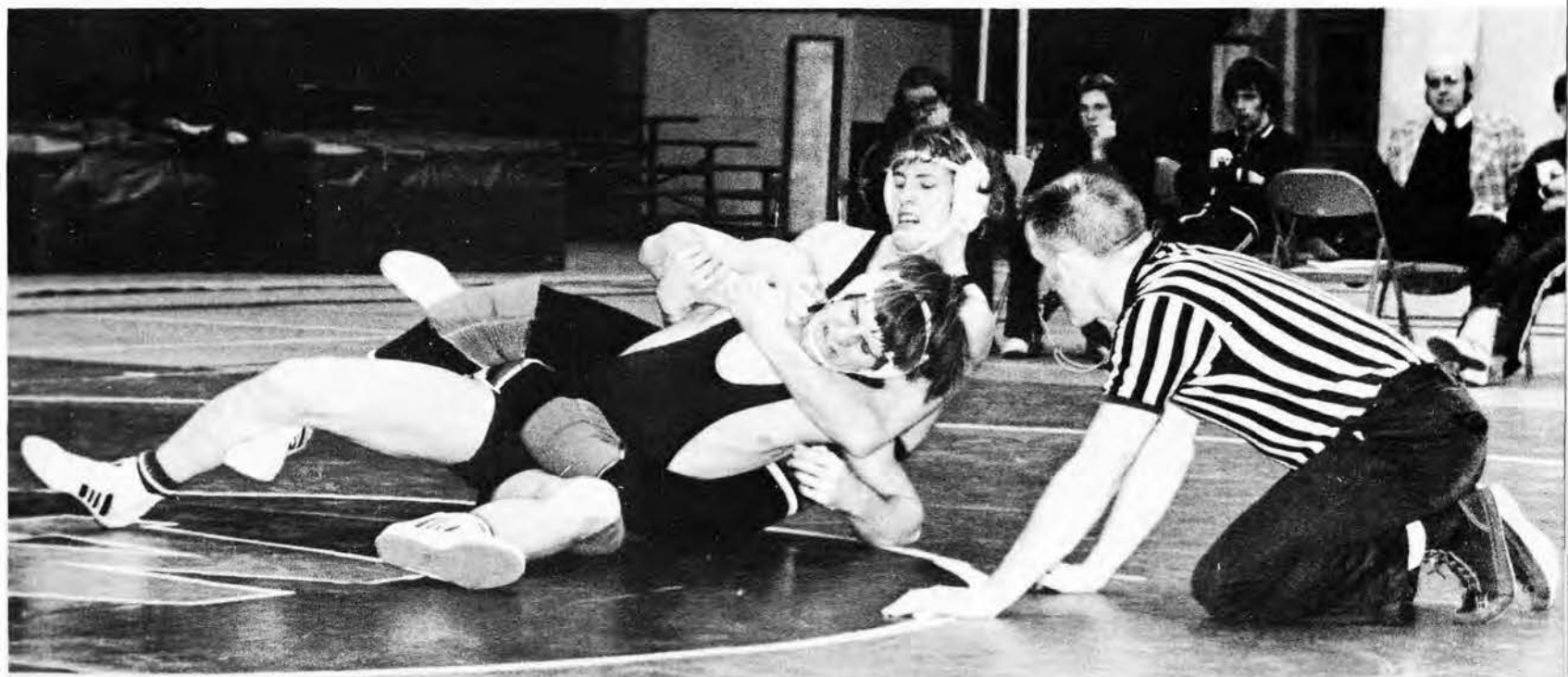
Rance Takes Title 9-9-1 Season Posted

These were the thoughts of Coach Mark Kondo as he reflected upon the 9-9-1 record they posted. Wrestling is a tough sport. Practice is two grueling hours of running stairs until it feels as though your lungs will burst. The throb of aching arms as you do one more push-up, practicing moves until they're so ingrained into your memory that you have dreams about them at night, and a host of mat burns from thirty minute stints of wrestling without a break. With all these aspects of wrestling a wrestler's attitude must be important. "I think basically the way they wrestle should be an extension of their life-style," emphasized Coach Kondo, "that is, I hope kids will come here first to get an education and also to deepen their Christian commitment because I feel Whitworth is a good place for that. When they go out on the mat I want them to wrestle as hard as they can. I want them to be aggressive but to remember that they are wrestling people. I hope that during the course of their wrestling career they will be able to decide what their values are and their lifestyle."

"Maybe it's good for some of our people to get beat when they're young like this because when they get older and beat some guys on the mat they'll realize that it's not winning or losing that's really important."

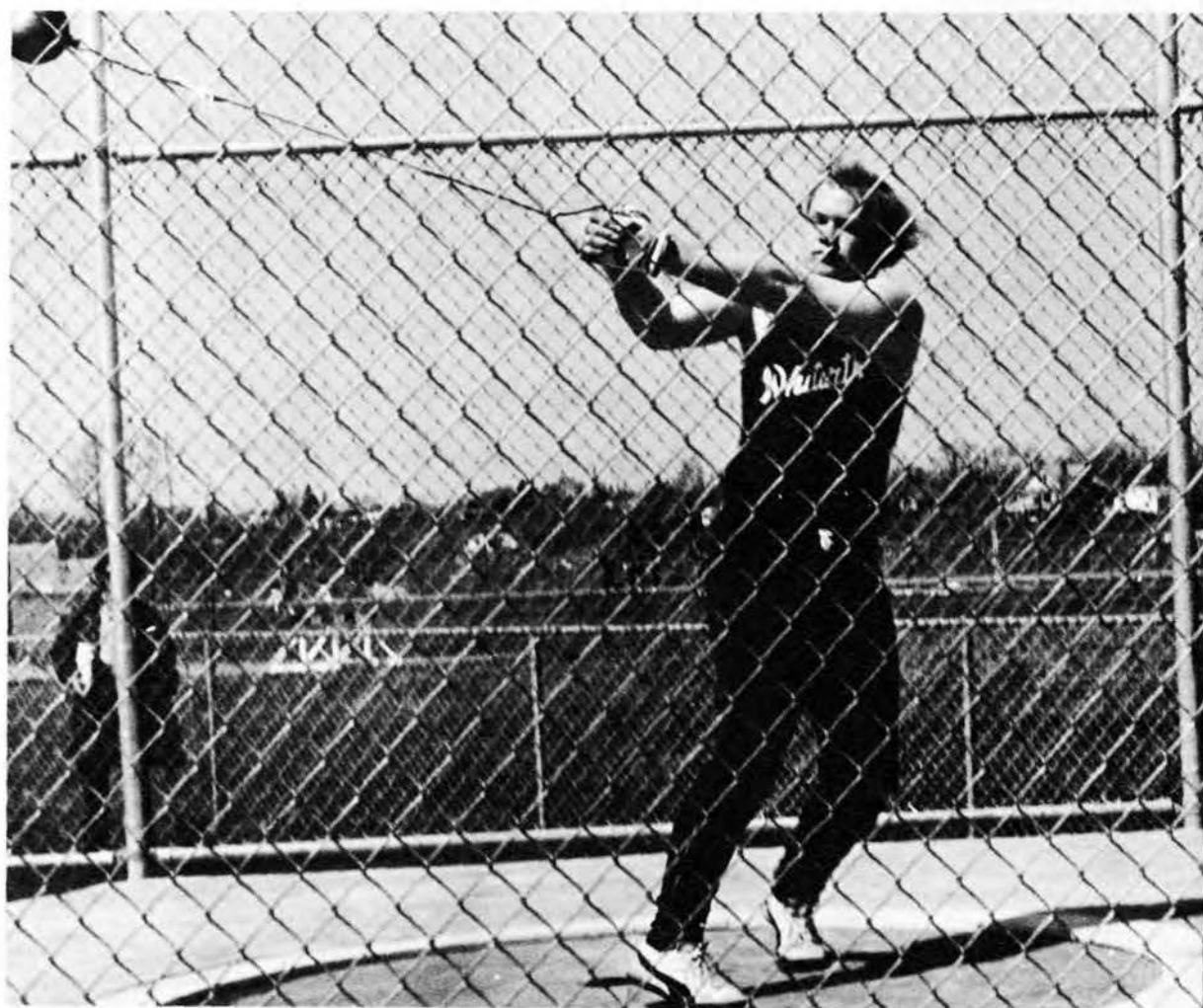

Highlighting this year's track season was Larry Lynch's impressive 120 yard High Hurdles victory in 14.7 seconds at the Conference Championships held at Pacific University the 9th and 10th of May. Lynch is also the defending District Champ. Other outstanding performers at that meet were Jerry Nnanabu who ran fourth in the 220 yard dash, Chris Roberts, who took fifth in the high jump and Dave Hunter who was 15th in the mile. 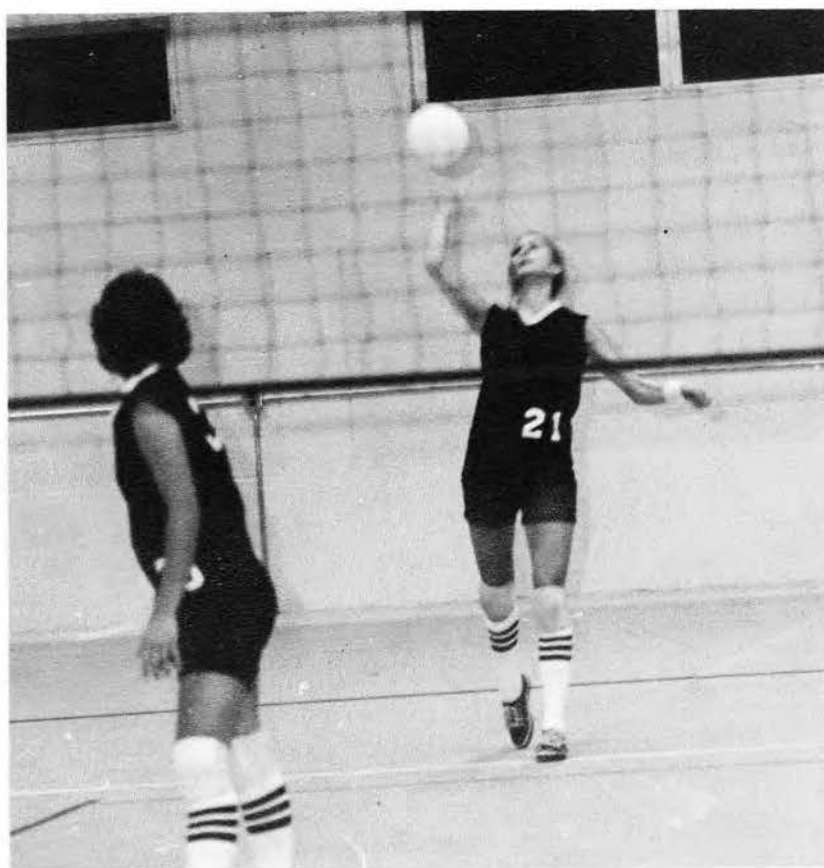
The team ran the standard 2.5 mile course in four of their five matches, under team captain Liz Roys.

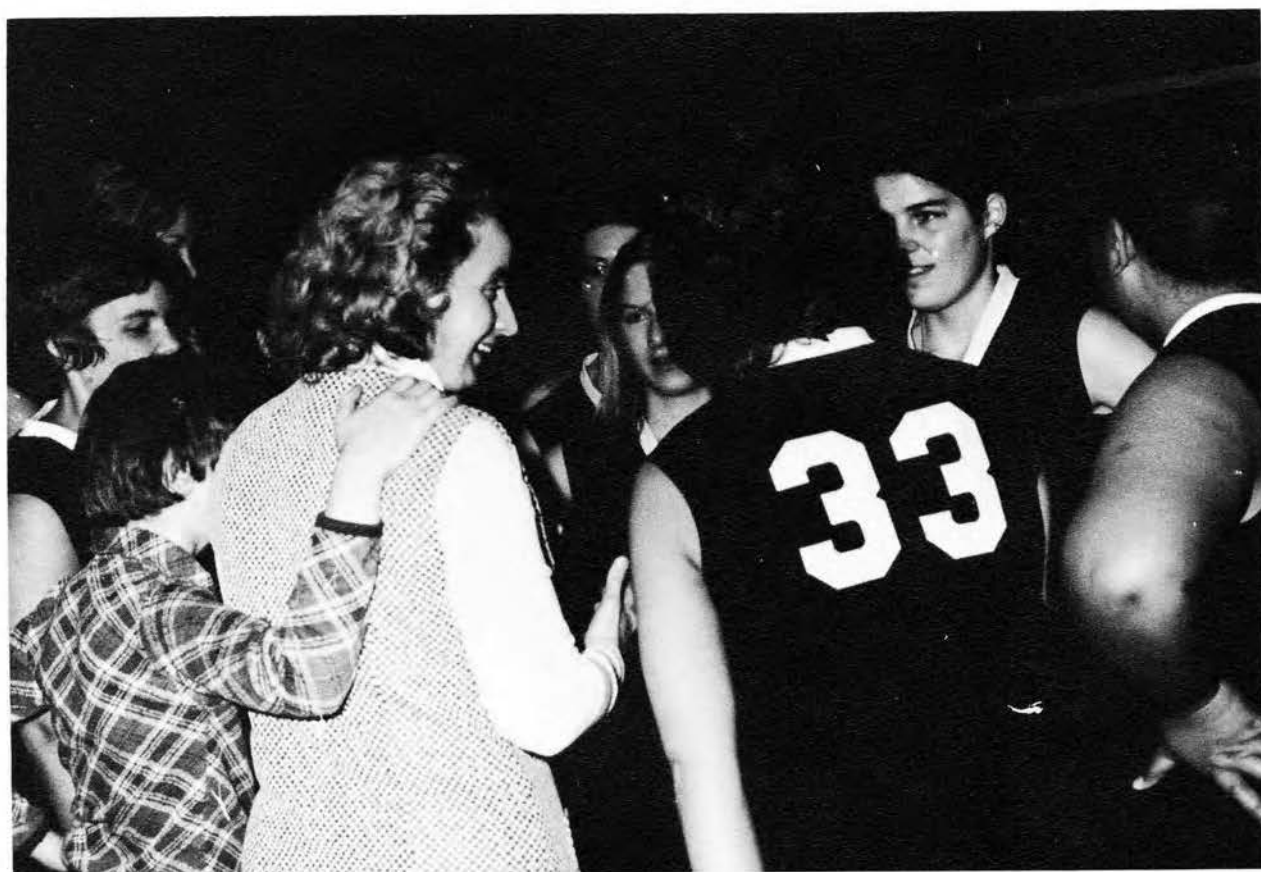

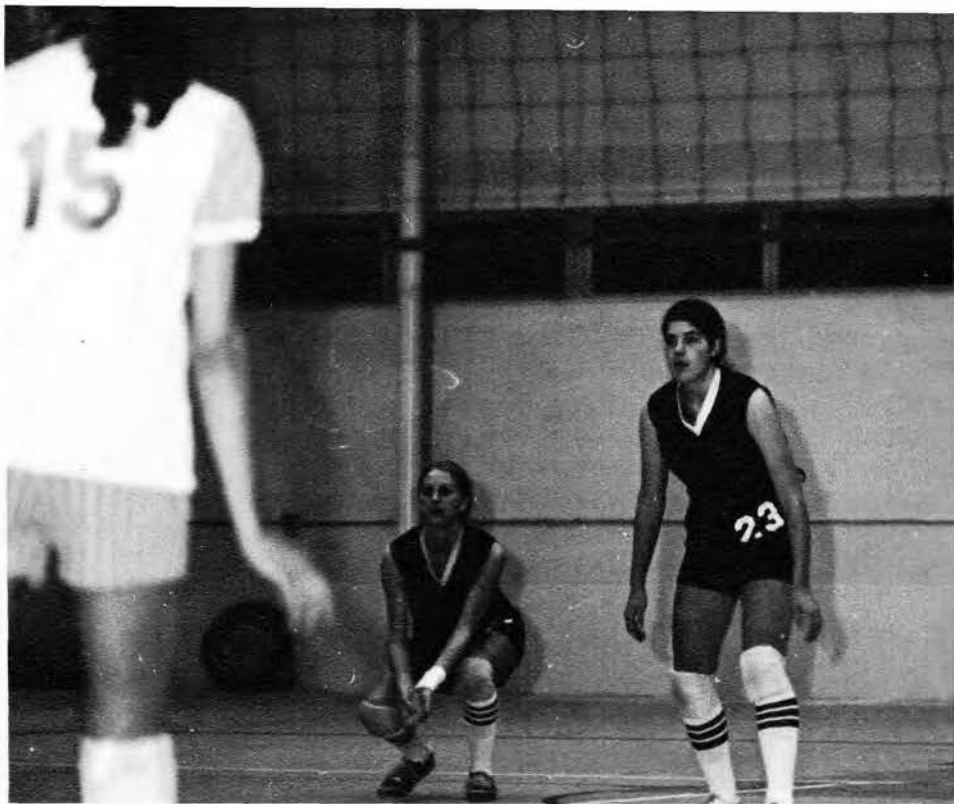


Above: A hard earned victory hug. Left: Cathie Pake giving her all in an intercollegiate meet. Center: Coach Steve Mize computes team statistics.

Women's Volleyball Team Captures Title, Honors

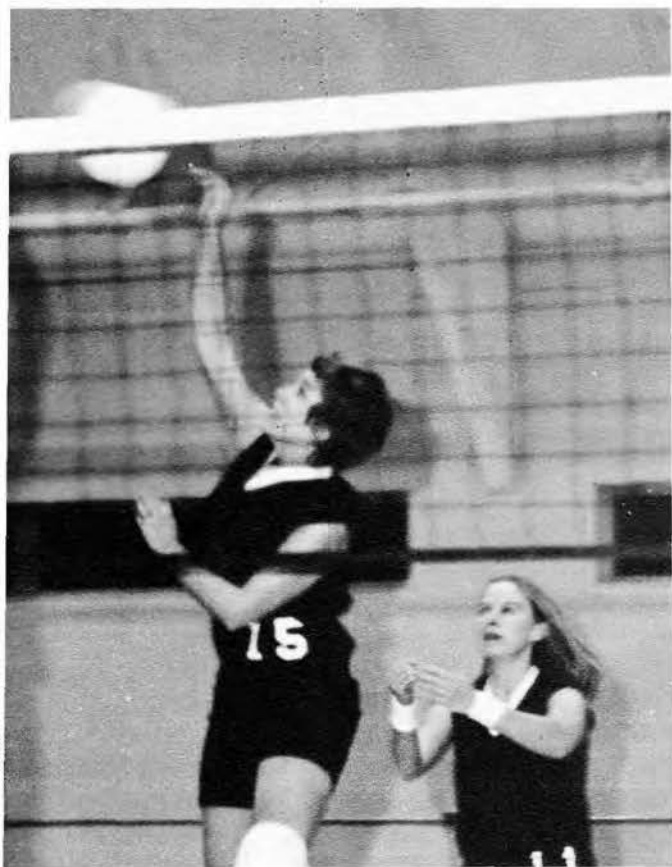
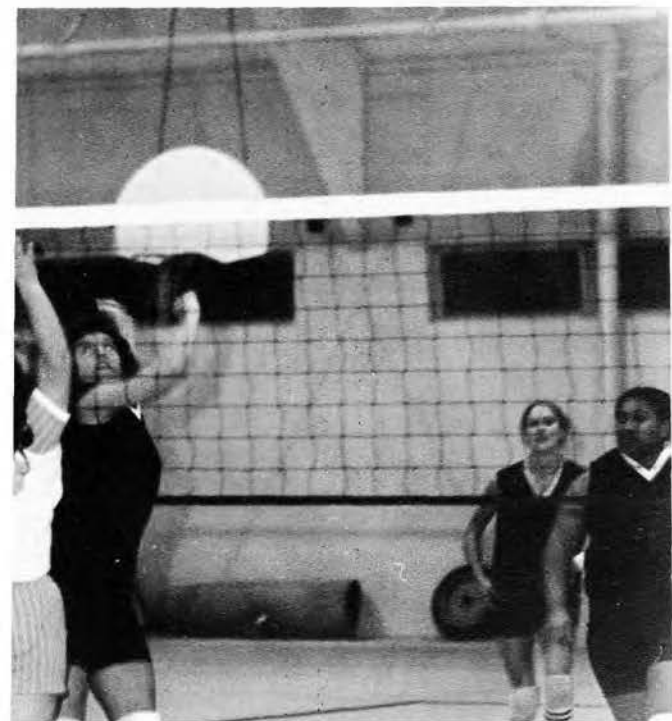

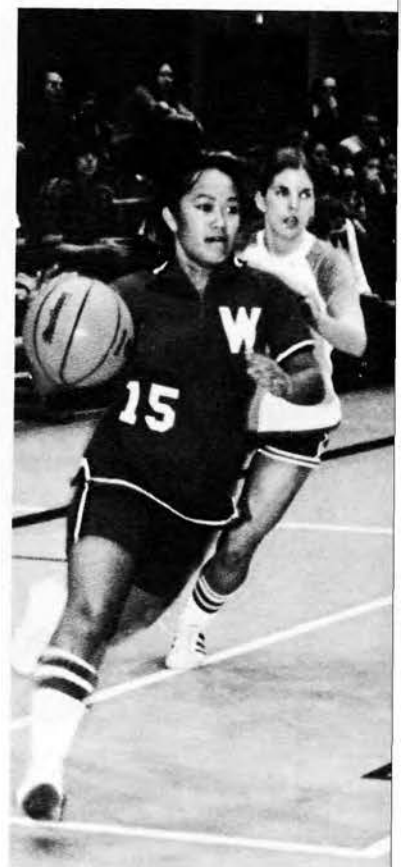

With twelve players, Whitworth's women's basketball team nabbed a 6-12 win-loss record, greatly improving last year's 2-13 tally.

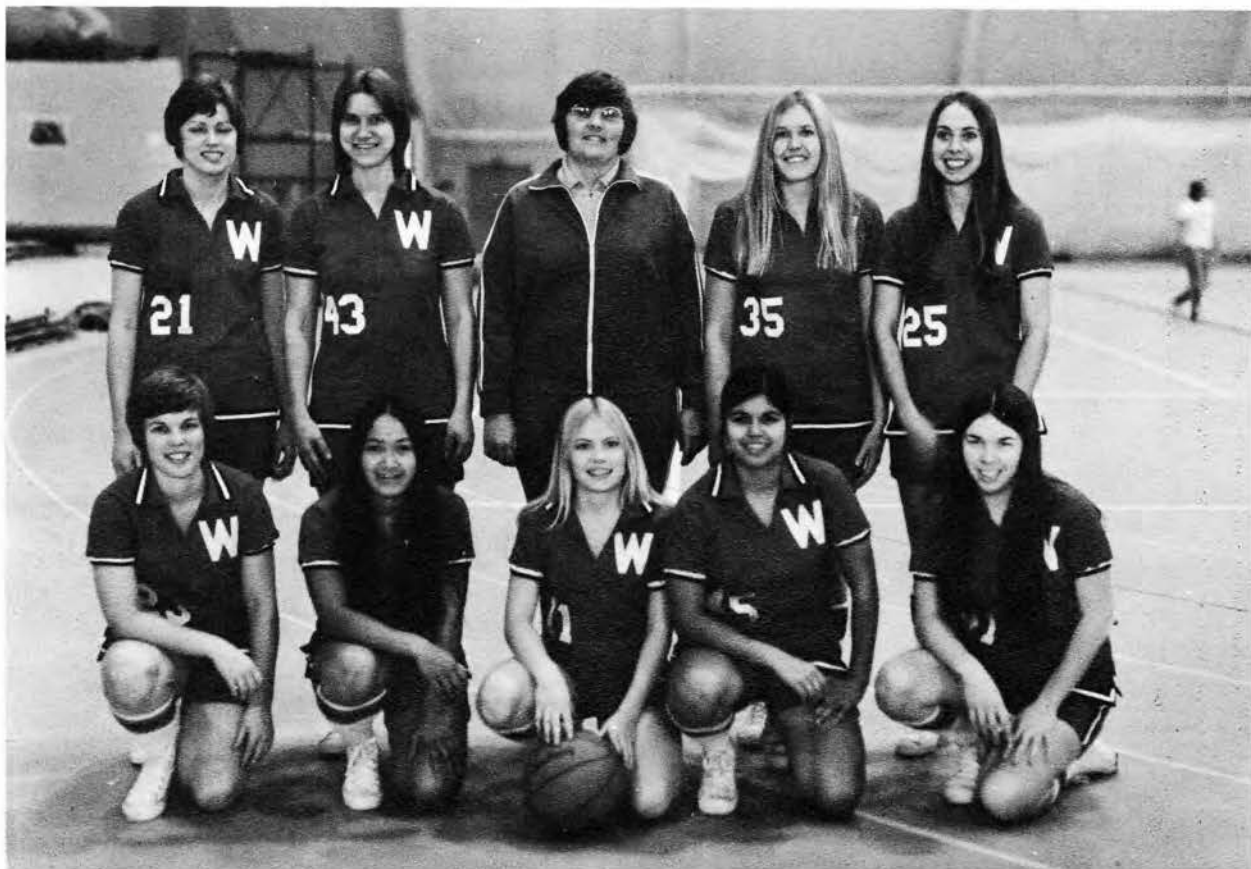

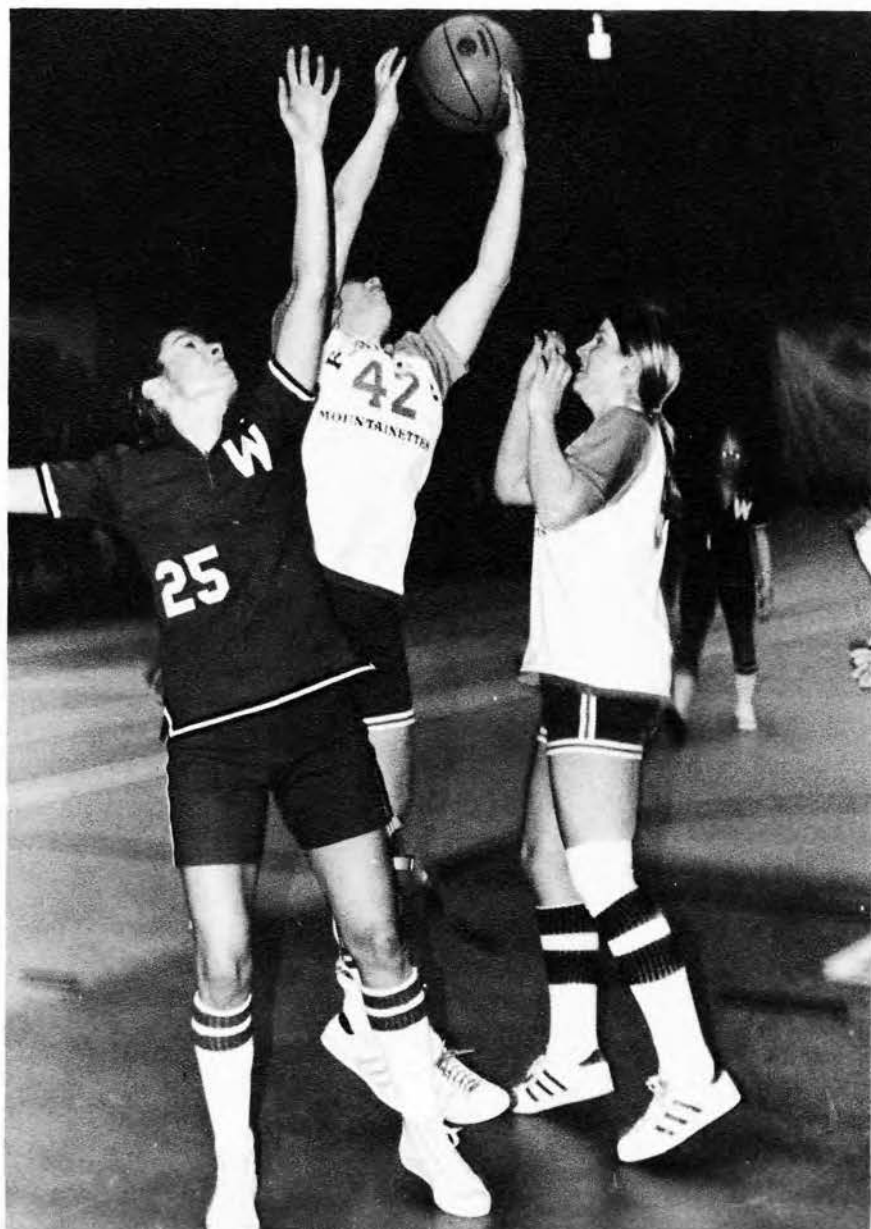

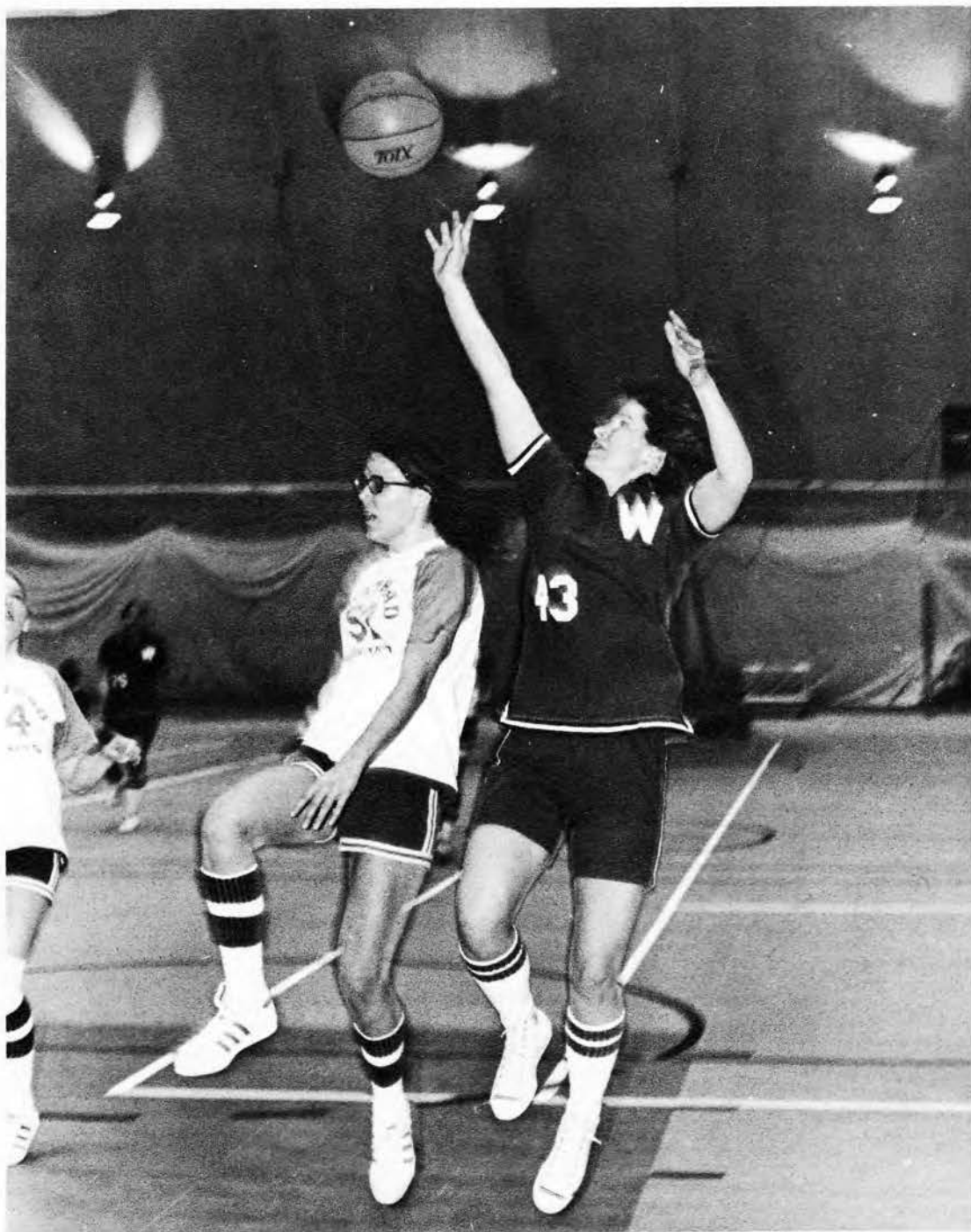

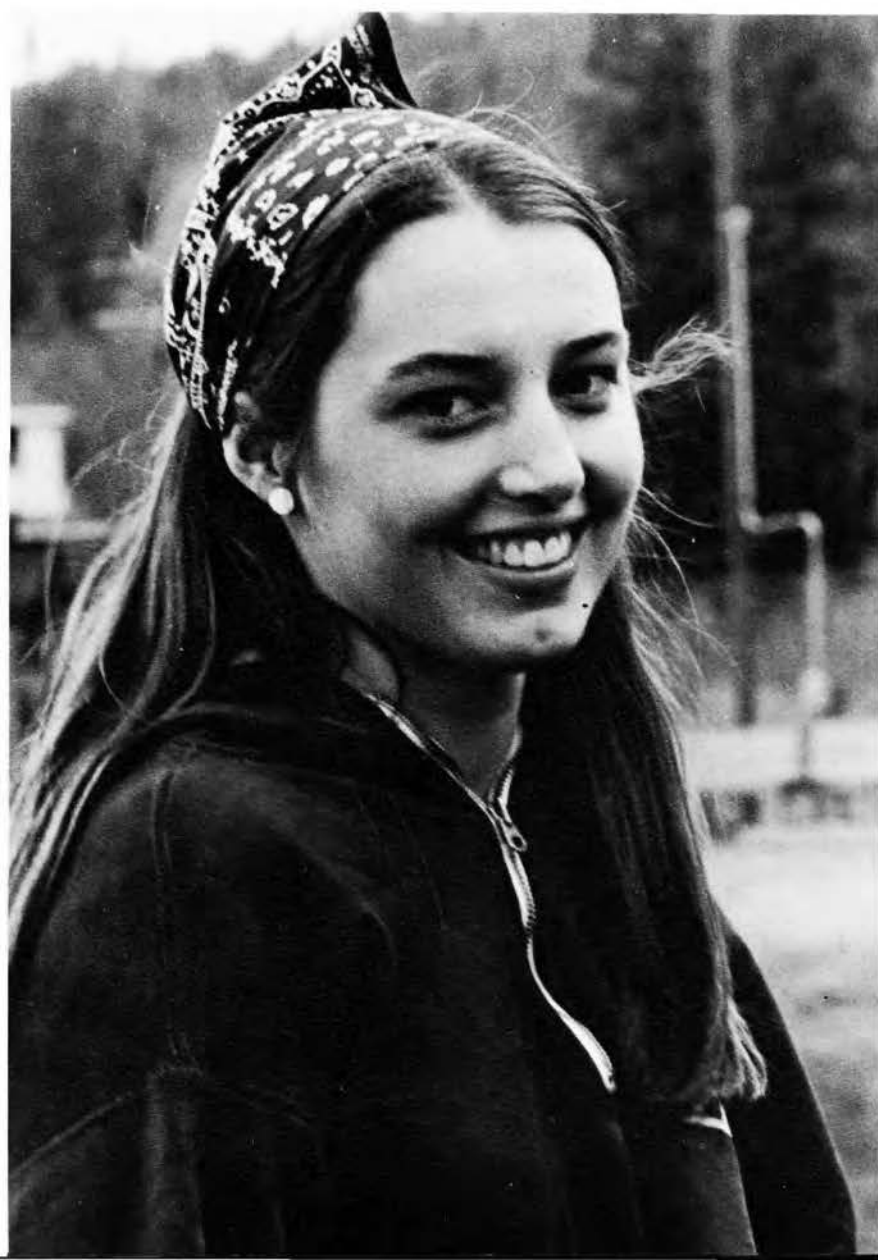

Coming seasons look prosperous also, with fifteen of the twenty team members being freshmen and only five veterans.

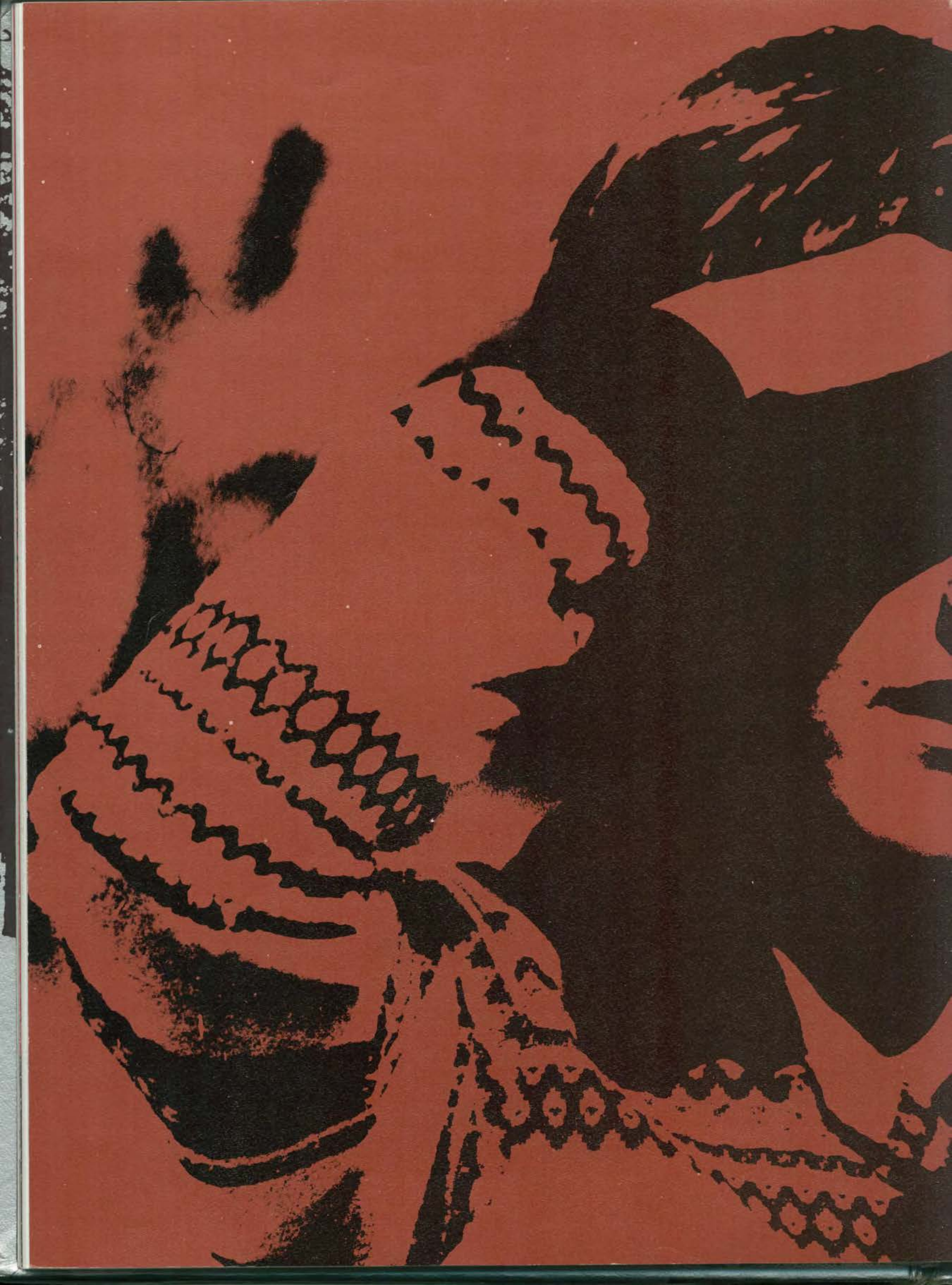

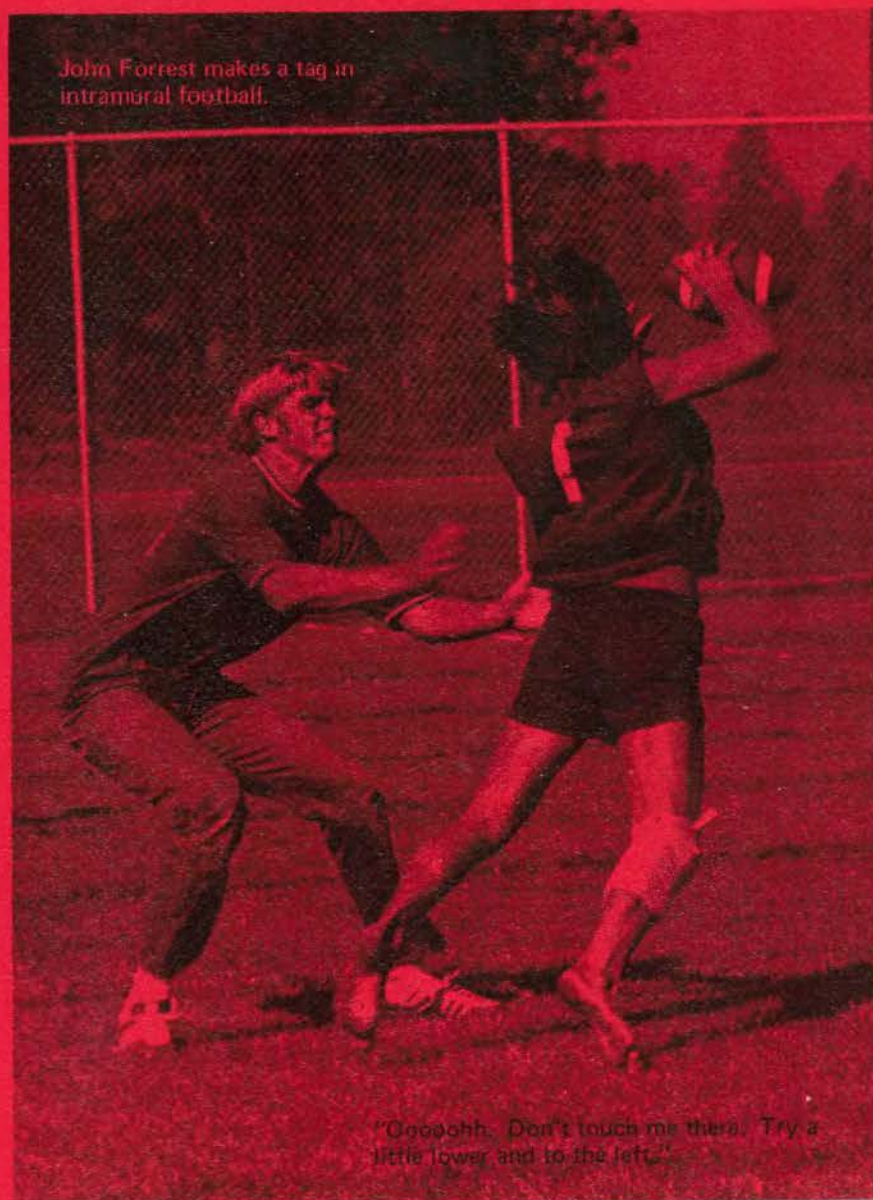
